3. Review & Acceptance of past meeting minutes from October 27, 2022
 - a. *Motion to accept presented by Scott S., seconded by Molly S., motion passes unanimously.*
4. Governor’s Data Advisory Board (GDAB) Briefing (Amy B.)

Amy Bhikha, Chief Data Officer for the State of Colorado chairs the GDAB and provided an overview of the wide- ranging activities of that group. There is a wealth of information on GDAB’s web page, including meeting archives, annual reports, subcommittee activities, other publications, and links to statutes pertaining to topics such as Personal Identifiable Information (PII) and interdepartmental data protocols.

5. Fatal and Serious Injury Scorecard

The updated scoreboard (data through 11/30/22) was presented along with a discussion of why vehicle miles of travel (VMT) is also reflected in the exhibits. Colorado will surpass last year’s fatality total with over 700 fatalities recorded year to date by the date of this meeting. VMT data is not yet available to help us to understand the extent to which the rate of vehicle travel has changed in 2022 as compared to the previous year. This information may be available by the March STRAC meeting.

Thus far, approximately \$750,000 in FY 23 projects have been identified. As shown above, the annual appropriation for Colorado increased significantly in FY 23 and there is approximately \$850,000 available. There is also a substantial amount of unspent funds currently in Colorado's 405C account. Starting in FY 24 there is opportunity to accomplish additional / more intensive traffic records improvement projects.

The following 405c short-form applications were presented and discussed for FY 24:

Traffic Records Coordinator: Sponsor - CDOT (David Swenka).

eCitation: Sponsor - DOR (Scott Spinks).

DRCOG Crash Data Consortium: Sponsor - DRCOG (Jacob Riger).

Technology Transfer: Sponsor - CDOT (BoYan Quinn).

Crash Data Dashboard / Data Visualization: Sponsor - CDOT (Mara Strother).

Geocoding: Sponsor - Adams County (Josh Sender).

At the conclusion of the project presentations, voting members of the STRAC approved all short-form applications to proceed to the long-form application for consideration at the March STRAC meeting.

7. STRAC Task Force Reports

Crash Manual Task Force

Have had 3 task force meetings now and are in the process of developing a survey for persons using the manual and DR 3447 crash form. Previewed the survey questions with the task force and got some great feedback that we are taking in and updating the survey. Aiming to have the survey sent out by the end of January 2023 to LEAs, data analysts, traffic engineers, and the like. Will be distributing 200 or so surveys and conducting several in-person interviews as well.

eCitation Task Force

eCitation group continues to meet regularly. The STRAC hijacked their last meeting to discuss the logistics of the eCitations 405C grant application. Worked through many of the questions that were outstanding sufficiently to allow a grant application to be submitted.

8. NHTSA/FHWA Updates

NHTSA is conducting a national survey to law enforcement on info collected on Crash Report forms in order to determine where there are issues with MMUCC. Training and update to the MMUCC to occur in February.

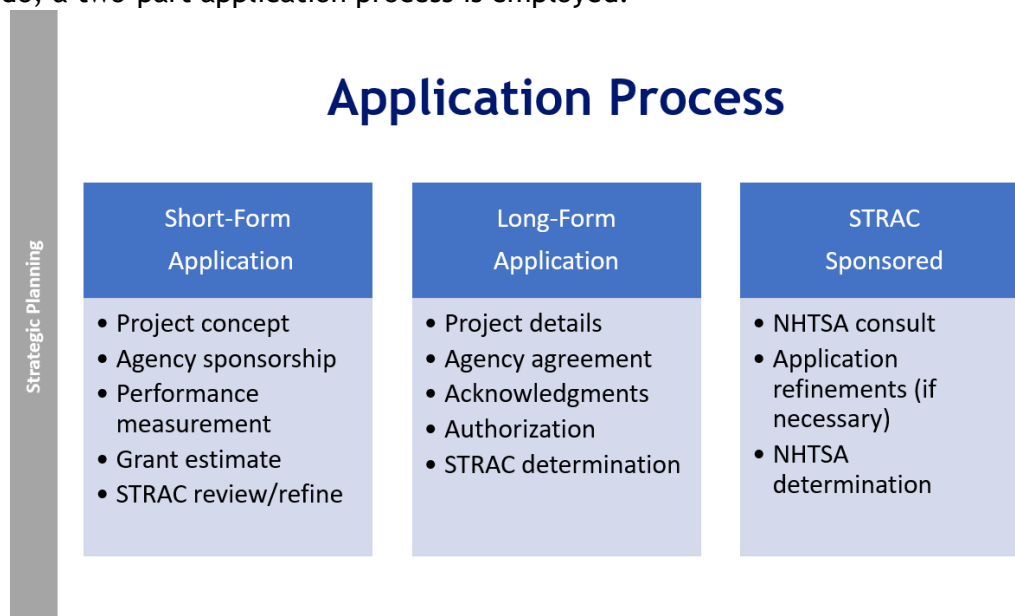
FHWA conducted a roadway data improvement program workshop and is sharing recommendations with CDOT leadership. Those project recommendations can be funded using federal funds.

Planning Meeting:

Strategic Plan Implementation - Barriers to 405c Grant Applications

- 405C is a NHTSA funded program to assist states in implementing traffic records strategic plan
- For the State of Colorado, the program is administered by CDOT (BoYan Quinn, BoYan.Quinn@state.co.us)
- Projects must advance one or more of the NHTSA 6 pack (timeliness, accuracy, completeness, uniformity, accessibility, and integration)
- Improvements must be measurable

In Colorado, a two-part application process is employed:



Where do 405c projects originate?

- Traffic Records Strategic Plan
- Traffic Records Assessment (NHTSA)
- Strategic Highway Safety Plan (Strategic Transportation Safety Plan)
- STRAC member agency priorities
- Other organizations, groups, and/or agencies
- Industry trends

Over the past several years, Colorado has not managed to capitalize on all of the available 405c funding, despite an awareness that traffic records improvements are needed in all of the state’s traffic records systems: Crash, Vehicle, Driver, Roadway, Injury Suveillance, and Citation/Adjudication.

At this point, the group discussed barriers that may be preventing Colorado agencies from seeking 405c grant funding. Obstacles and potential solutions are highlighted on the next two slides.

Obstacles & Potential Solutions

Staff time and commitment concerns (application itself, administration, reporting, etc)	Traffic Records Coordinator
Depth of team commitment required / priorities	Plan sufficient time for partners in your development schedule. Engage Execs
Data sharing agreement limitations	Conceptual / hypothetical case study
Insufficient data sources to support application	State data inventory / data stewards
Infrastructure limitations, particularly with smaller agencies	Strategic planning for infrastructure and interfaces between agencies

Performance measurement	Model performance measures for state traffic records systems manual

Contract complexity	Early review of contract

As we begin to formulate the FY 24 Traffic Records Strategic Plan, STRAC leadership will continue to work to minimize these obstacles through stakeholder outreach efforts; providing training, support and resource materials; advocacy and other actions.

For the State of Colorado, the Highway Safety Office has agreed to provide the local match for agencies that submit FY 24 grant applications - removing one of the obstacles noted by many as an obstacle to a 405c grant.
