3. MOU

- CDOT will send out 2012 MOU and Strategic Plan to Bratt for all STRAC members to review.
- Bratt suggests not to create a new document if previous document can be used

4. Clarification of roles (Bratt)

What’s the role of STRAC and new projects?

- NHTSA’s view 408 -projects that were received were given a conditional approval.
- NHTSA wants to focus on approving (E-Citation) projects
- Developing a repository residing in DOR or Judicial in the future
- STRAC come together with a statewide plan for repository
- Electronic data from roadside
- From court to DOR
- Bratt developed a broad overview of where STRAC is satisfying NHTSA’s concerns.
- NHTSA will accept document provided that further planning addressed throughout the year.

Where do we see STRAC?

- Talk to other states to see what they are doing in regards to sharing the data

Grant Submission

- Reviewing short forms
- Make sure information in grant was in alignment of assessment
- Proactive role in grant approval process

E-Citation – Accident Report:

{CDOT: Road conditions, Go location, Quality Control, crash type, Engineering Analysis, FASTER - OTS: Crash reports, FARS, Problem ID

- Helping agency with developing tools
- Loop back to officer

Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment (CDPHE)

- Patient care report/accident report from CDOT/FARS
- Safety aspect {i.e. – seat belts}
- Problem identification report

Colorado Department of Public Safety (CDPS)

- Intelligent policing
- Where crashes are happening, time, day of the week
- Better enforcement

Denver Police

- Identifies top ten locations
- Data collection

Jefferson County (Jeffco)

- CSP handles all crash data
- Go thru DOR for crash reports
- CDOT holder of crash data (should be located in EARS)

DOR

- Provider of custodian records by picking apart other access
- Information is not located in the same place
- Most states data users are data holders
- Most states DOT would be responsible for crash data
- Cleansing and location
- NHTSA would like DOR to be data depository
- Data should be extracted (info from Traffic Records Forum)
- 40% of crash data is held at state DOT and 20% is at DOR (info from Traffic Records Forum)
- CDOT data more engineering data
 - o Need to distribute to partners
 - o STRAC is helping with strategic vision of data and provided to customers

How can it be done more freely and openly?

- Legislative directive that DOR holds data
- Where are the best users for data?
- STRAC really needs to work hard to develop data user community
- Strongly develop an accessibility user database
- Can be developed through STRAC
- User force will be stronger
- State of Louisiana has a robust place to get data

Ticket: {Loop back to Officer}

- Record
- Tickets are sent to DOR
- Judicial
- Aurora, Denver and Greenwood Village tickets are sent to Municipal Court
- CSP writes a ticket and the ticket is sent to DOR
- If ticket is paid DOR handles
- If ticket is not paid, Judicial handles

- DUI tickets are sent to DOR
- Municipal court reports to DOR
- Municipal and Judicial do not use data collected
- Uses it on the backend for previous driving history
- Have access to driver's record
- Interest in developing charging
- Original charging is what's on your record @ DOR
- Engineering just what adjudicated for

6. 405 Grant Submissions

- Denver PD, \$75,000
 - o Approved
 - o {Aurora PD would be able to piggyback off Denver PD project}
- Aurora PD - \$90,000
 - o Approved

- Condition: Must return to STRAC with report on plans
 - Match with schema for County Court
 - Goal: Courts going to electronic format
- Jefferson County - \$34,300
 - Approved
 - Hire someone to clean data
 - Purchase software
 - Would like five years of good data
 - Condition: Loop must be closed with CDOT
 - CDOT to start developing partnership with local jurisdictions
 - Ask Jeffco and CDOT to present at STRAC
- Greenwood Village PD - \$42,750
 - Approved
 - Project will eventually pay for itself
- CDPHE - \$95,938
 - Approved
 - Funding will continue statewide
 - Care provided to motor vehicle crashes
 - More data for patient care and emergency care
 - State purchased a database (Image-trend)
 - Funding is used for personnel to maintain information distributed to agencies
 - Condition: Ask CDPHE to back to STRAC and share EMS Collections
- Boulder County SO - \$30,885
 - Approved
 - Issue: Where is data going?
 - Condition: Must have an existing court partner ready to accept data
 - Short and long term plan in electronic format
- Broomfield PD - \$9,000
 - Not approved as of 2/14/2013
 - Issue: How will it benefit traffic records and traffic safety?
 - Does STRAC agree with Broomfield's strategic plan?
 - What does data sharing option mean?
 - Not traffic related
 - Potential for future crash data and crash data analysis
- Castle Rock - \$8,989
 - Approved
 - Submitted late from 2012
- Elbert County S.O. - \$41,157
 - Approved (conditionally)

- How are tickets getting into County Court?
- Colorado Springs Police Department - \$40,352
 - Not approved as 2/14/2013
 - Issue: How is CSPD going to measure completeness
- TARS - \$49,500
 - Not approved – 2/14/2013
 - Need more information from vendor
 - Have vendor attend STRAC meeting
 - Issues:
 - Have vendor explain performing measures
 - Explain what product is
- CDOT EARS Maintenance – \$25,000
 - Not approved – 2/14/2013
 - Need more info and have vendor attend STRAC meeting
