## CCCP for 2019

- DTR has announced 2019 Consolidated Call for Capital Projects
- Announced this opportunity widely across the state, through a variety of sources
- An opportunity to apply for capital funds for
  - replacement vehicles
  - expansion vehicles
  - alternative fuel replacement vehicles
  - transit facilities
  - equipment
  - major engineering studies

## CCCP for 2019

- NOT for operating or administrative funds—that application is in the spring
- Available to public and private nonprofit providers for both
  - public transportation
  - specialized services for elderly and disabled persons
- Statewide competitive application process. Applications due December 7

## CCCP for 2019

- \$9.6M in Federal funds
- \$23M in State funds
- A total of over \$32M available for 2019
- Significant increase over this year, mostly due to two new programs and carryover funds
- Funds available for differing purposes and geographical areas

## **New Programs**

- "Settlement" program offers \$3.6M for alternative fuel buses
  - Electric, propane or CNG
  - Must replace conventionally-fueled vehicles
  - Offers 110% of incremental cost
  - Offers electric charging equipment
- Senate Bill 267 offers \$9.5M for infrastructure projects in RURAL counties—those with less than 50,000 population
