SUBJECT: Senate Bill 228 Status Report

Purpose

The purpose of this memo is to provide an update on SB 228 transit projects approved for Years 1,2, and 3.

Action

Informational only, no action requested.

Background

Senate Bill 228 (SB 228) provided CDOT with \$200M in new revenue in FY 2016, \$79M in FY 2017, and \$79 in FY 2018. At least 10% (approximately \$35.8M = \$20M + \$7.9M + \$7.9M) must be dedicated to transit. The SB 228 program must be used for strategic, TC-approved projects with statewide or regional significance.

In August 2016 the Transportation Commission approved \$20 Million in commitments toward a list consisting mainly of park-and-ride investments around the state, and bus purchases for rural regional services now branded as "Bustang Outrider". Two of the projects were withdrawn and the funds will be re-programmed in future years.

In November 2017 the Commission approved \$9.9 Million in projects which consisted of bus purchases, match for rail improvements, and funds for local agency capital purchases (\$7.9 M year 2 funds, +\$2.0 M re-programmed from year 1 funds).

In August 2018 the Commission approved \$10.9 Million in projects which consisted of bus purchases, local agency capital purchases, and park-and-ride investments.

Details

SB 228 Project Update

The following table provides a brief description of each project and its current status. A more detailed schedule is included as an attachment.
