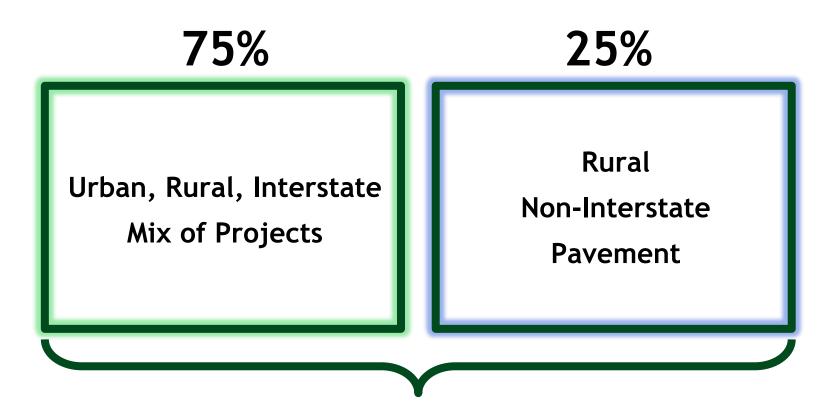
# Planning for Years 5-10

FY 23/24 - FY 28/29



- Highway planning ranges use RPP formula.
- \$500 million per year (for six years) totaling \$3 billion
- Above the base program, no base programs expressed
- 90% for Highways
  - 25 percent for rural non-interstate pavement
  - 75 percent for a mix of urban, rural, and interstate capital projects.
  - 50 percent of the total investment should include elements of all assets
- 10% for Transit
  - 10 percent of 10% for CDOT Bustang (I-25 & I-70) operations expansion
  - 90 percent distributed by 25% to rural counties, then MMOF ratios

- Stay consistent with current plans



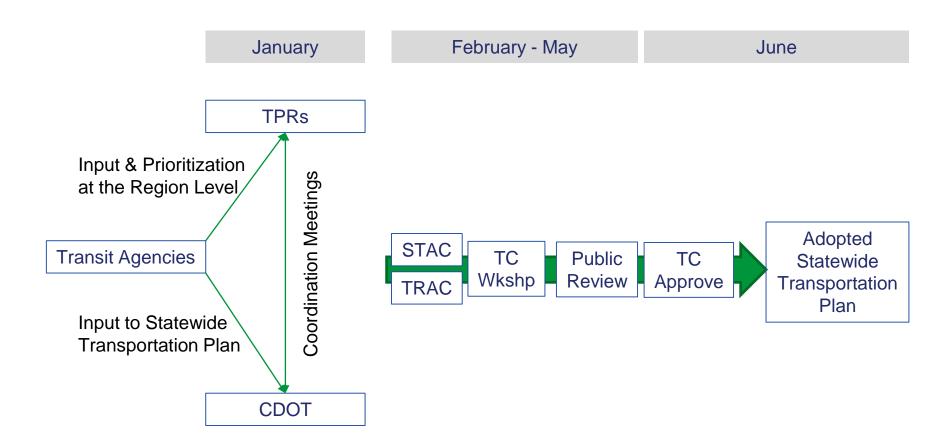
