SB 267 Transit Background

- SB 267 Program for Years 1 through 4 (\$192M) were approved by Transportation Commission by resolution in December 2019
 - TC approved \$192M for transit projects
 - Funding distributed equitably across TPR's and Regions based upon MMOF
 - Approved transit program met 25% minimum rural requirement of SB 267
- Transportation Commission delegated authority to DTR for Consolidated Capital Call for Projects
 - DTR released NOFA and awarded additional projects in March 2020
- Pueblo Administrative and Maintenance Facility project approved by TC in March 2020

Worst Case Transit Budget Scenario

Plan for the worst, hope for the best.

Worst case would be only 2 years of SB 267 funding:

- \$42 Million "Year 1" (FY2018-19) Funds in the bank
- \$50 Million "Year 2" (FY2019-20) Funds COPs to be sold May 2020
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- \$92 Million
- 47.9% of original expectations



Proposed Transit Prioritization Methodology for Projects Currently Committed

- 1. Advance projects already in progress (e.g., scoping, design, construction)
- 2. Advance projects leveraged by competitive federal grants and partner funding
- 3. Advance transit projects that are combined with funded highway projects
- 4. Honor awarded capital call projects

- → We think this prioritization would lead us to \$50 \$70 Million in "committed" projects (26% to 36% of the full list)
- → Additional criteria would come into play to select the remaining projects or portions of projects to fully expend the available \$92 Million.
