New in This Super Call:

- "Other Factors" criteria was added to the project evaluation, reinforcing the state goals outlined in the <u>Colorado Greenhouse Gas Pollution Reduction Roadmap</u>, including priorities around greenhouse gas reduction, air quality improvement, Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) reduction, and equity for disadvantaged communities.
- Local Match waiver and relief were added in consideration of COVID impacts and provided flexibility on local match requirement.
