

Governance: Development of a New Entity

Governance: New Entity Types

- Type 2 entity (current structure)
- Project specific special legislative entity
- Regional service authority
- Transportation enterprise
- Type 1 entity (division of CDOT)

Policy Committee Assumptions

Assumption:

- A FRPR governance proposal and funding proposal should be separate legislative proposals

Assumption:

 In 2020, whatever proposal is recommended needs to help keep up the momentum for Front Rage Passenger Rail and establish a clear path forward for implementation

Assumption:

- The FRPR system end points will be Fort Collins to Pueblo with options to extend north or south

Assumption:

- There is no predetermined technology to be used in the corridor

Assumption:


 Governance proposal needs to include flexibility for Public Private Parnterships (P3) and value capture opportunities

Assumption:

 Governance options need to include opportunities for cooperative efforts with CDOT, HPTE, RTD and Class 1 Railroads as appropriate
