AMTRAK'S SOUTHWEST CHIEF AND ITS ROUTE

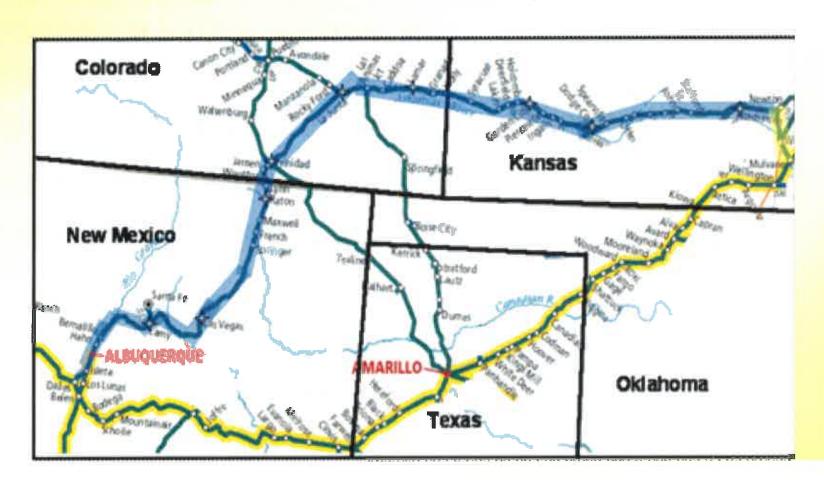
- Streamliner running from Chicago to Los Angeles via Kansas City, Southeastern Colorado, Albuquerque and Flagstaff with 33 stops
- Follows the historic Santa Fe Trail in Colorado and New Mexico over Raton Pass
- Serves many rural communities like Lamar, La Junta and Trinidad in Colorado
- Rail line was forged by the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad in the 1880's
- Hosted famous trains including the Super Chief "Train of the Stars" which ran from 1936 until 1971
- Became an Amtrak train in 1971, upgraded to Superliners in 1982

AT ISSUE

IN 2011, DISCONTINUING THE SOUTHWEST CHIEF WAS UNDER SERIOUS CONSIDERATION:

- 632 miles of track between Newton, KS, and Lamy, NM, in disrepair, particularly in Kansas and Colorado
- Amtrak contract with BNSF Railway expires in 2016
- BNSF traffic over the route had declined since the original contract was executed 25 years ago
- BNSF pegged the increased Amtrak share for maintenance and repairs at over \$200 million over ten years, well beyond Amtrak's budget

AT STAKE

- Ridership for local and out of state travelers
- Employment and payroll
- Economic benefits such as tourism
- •New opportunities e.g. Pueblo Service, Colorado Front Range Rail, other future rail links along the route (e.g. Oklahoma, Texas)!

Mobilizing to Save the Chief

- 2011 ColoRail "shoe leather" advocacy campaign in 2011-2012 generates 19 resolutions of support and culminates in a three state Southwest Chief Coalition with leadership from La Junta, CO, Garden City, KS, and Colfax County (Raton), NM (one elected and one senior manager each): Community Leaders buy in!
- 2012 ColoRail (advocate) hosts leadership excursions on the SW Chief for Mayors, Legislators, Congressional Staff to build understanding and support. Amtrak conductors support each trip.
- 2012 Congressional efforts for federal funding in 2012 lead to new strategy for 2013: You have to have skin in the game! (Federal funds must be matched say our Congressional Leaders)
- 2013 Coalition convenes 2013 "Southwest Chief Summit" in Pueblo, CO, to enlist more champions who can help get public and private funding for the campaign. Commissioner Sal Pace answers the call!
- 2013 Campaign goes on the offensive: Lets add Pueblo as a stop! Lets seek TIGER Grant funding!
- 2014 New leadership forges legislative strategies in CO and NM, while KS turns to KDOT to take the lead. Colorado Act creates SW Chief Commission.

Accomplishments

- Legislation in Colorado creating Commission
 - Commissioners represent important sectors: Local, County,
 Freight Rail, Amtrak, CDOT, Advocacy and Transit
 - Commission can receive and expend funds
 - Commission tasked to look at additional stops in Pueblo and Walsenburg
 - Commissioners support intermodal transportation
 - Commission is an official state agency focused on the train

ACCOMPLIHMENTS (cont'd)

- Coalition lead by Garden City obtains 2014 TIGER 6 Grant
 - BNSF, Kansas DOT and Amtrak pledge \$ 9 million match
 - 14 Colorado and Kansas Counties/Communities/Advocates provide over \$330,000: Key matching support
 - BNSF will repair worst track segments to maximize improving the SW Chief's performance
 - US DOT awards \$12.5 million grant!

ACCOMPLISHMENTS (cont'd)

- Coalition Lead by La Junta Obtains 2015 TIGER 7 Grant
 - Colorado and New Mexico DOT's join application
 - 22 communities/counties/advocates from 3 states join application
 - US DOT awards \$15.2 million grant!
- Rail manufactured in Pueblo, Colorado!
- Over \$46 million has now been raised and 137 miles of track will be replaced or improved by the end of 2016 creating "time table" space for Pueblo stop

ACCOMPLISHMENTS (cont'd)

- Success leads BNSF to assume full maintenance costs for restored track relieving Amtrak of huge burden
- Commission seeking "through car service" for Pueblo and beyond
 - Chicago to Pueblo service on dedicated cars cut off at La Junta
 - Colorado Springs at 40 miles, and Denver at 110 miles, create realistic Front Range passenger rail scenario
 - Ballot measure: Pueblo voters approved funding in 2016
 - Transition into the Southwest Chief & Front Range Passenger
 Rail Commission
