

**Resolution # TC-17-10-5**

Repeal of Policy Directive 1006.0 "Adopt-A-Highway Program"

**Approved by the Transportation Commission on October 19, 2017.**

**WHEREAS**, under § 43-1-106(8), C.R.S., the Transportation Commission of Colorado has the statutory responsibility to set policies for the Colorado Department of Transportation ("CDOT"); and

**WHEREAS**, Policy Directive 1006.0 was adopted on April 19, 2002, and states that it is the Department's policy to allow volunteers and corporations to adopt or sponsor segments of highway for litter control purposes, and directs the Department to establish Procedural Directives to support this policy; and

**WHEREAS**, the Department recently consolidated two Procedural Directives that support this policy and set forth procedures to implement the volunteer and sponsorship programs into updated Procedural Directive 1006.1, and


**WHEREAS**, the Department has taken steps to improve the implementation of both the volunteer and sponsorship programs by contracting with a vendor to manage the initial administrative process for both programs and the overall business administration and financial day-to-day operations for the sponsorship program; and

**WHEREAS**, the procedures to support and implement the Adopt-A-Highway Program is fully addressed in Procedural Directive 1006.1, and therefore Policy Directive 1006.0 is no longer necessary to ensure that the Department allow volunteers and sponsors to adopt or sponsor segments of highway for litter control purposes.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the Commission herein repeals Policy Directive 1006.0 "Adopt-A-Highway Program."
