

**Resolution #TC-20-07-04**

Resolution to Approve Legislative Memorial Designations

**Approved by the Transportation Commission on July 16, 2020.**

**WHEREAS**, the Transportation Commission adopted Policy Directive 1503.0 to establish a consistent statewide process regarding designation or memorializing of a highway, bridge or any other highway component; and

**WHEREAS**, the Colorado General Assembly has the authority, by Act or Resolution, to approve designations or memorializing highways, bridges, or any other components of the highway system. And, the Transportation Commission has the authority to accept such requests from the Colorado General Assembly; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2020 during the Second Regular Session, of the State of Colorado's Seventy-Second General Assembly has adopted the following Senate Joint Resolutions and House Joint Resolution; and

**WHEREAS**, during the 2020 Legislative Session the General Assembly adopted Senate Joint Resolution 20-021 designating a portion of Portion of Colorado Highway 44 from Colorado Highway 2 to I-25 in Adams County as the "Deputy Gumm Memorial Highway" in recognition of Adams County Sheriff Deputy Gumm who was shot and killed during a foot pursuit near 88th Avenue and Dawson Street in Thornton in 2018 and;

**WHEREAS**, during the 2020 Legislative Session the General Assembly adopted House Joint Resolution HJR19-1003 designating Highway 24 from the intersection of Garrett Road to the intersection of Elbert Rd in Falcon as the "SGM James Gregory Ryan Sartor Memorial Highway" memorializing Company Sergeant Major of Alpha Company, 2nd Battalion of 10th Special Forces Group for his service in Faryab, Province, Afghanistan where he came under enemy fire, sustaining injuries from small-arms fire, and sadly died from those injuries. He was posthumously awarded the Purple Heart, the Legion of Merit, and the Bronze Star Medal. ; and

**WHEREAS**, during the 2020 Legislative Session the General Assembly adopted House Joint Resolution HJR18-1004 designating C- 470 from University Boulevard to Santa Fe Drive in southwestern metro Denver as the "Kendrick Castillo Memorial Highway" recognizes student Kendrick's heroic sacrifice at STEM School Highlands Ranch; and

**WHEREAS**, during the 2020 Legislative Session the General Assembly adopted House Joint Resolution HJR18-1009 designating State Highway 291 from Salida to U.S. Highway in Chaffee as the "Corporal Ray Lines Memorial Highway" recognizing his sacrifice Word War I as part of of the 341st Air Artillery, 89th Division, in France. On September 18, 1918, one year to the day after he had entered the service. He was the only Salida soldier killed during World War I and the entire town lined the streets when his body was returned to Salida and later the Salida Post of the American Legion was named after him.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Transportation Commission hereby confirms Senate Joint Resolution 20-021 and House Resolutions 20-1003 20-1004, 20-1009.
