Executive Summary: The Department has undertaken an effort to evaluate existing policies and procedural directives and repeal those that have been determined as no longer necessary. As part of this initiative, the Department requests that the Transportation Commission repeal Policy Directive 800.0 “State Highway Safety Agency” as it is no longer relevant.

The Policy Directive no longer contains correct information; specifically, it no longer reflects the current structure of the Traffic and Safety Engineering Branch.

PURPOSE

To establish policy that will cover the duties, responsibilities, functions, and activities of the State Highway Safety Agency.

POLICY

It is the policy of the State of Colorado, and the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) to have a state highway safety agency (SHSA) reporting to the Executive Director of the Department of Transportation, responsible for coordination of all statewide traffic safety activity. Pursuant to CRS 24-42-101, there is hereby created an Office of Transportation Safety that will act as the SHSA for this Department. The Director of this office shall be appointed by and report directly to the CDOT Executive Director. The Director of the Office of Transportation Safety is allowed by statute to appoint the necessary staff to carry out the duties and functions of the office as described in statute. The CDOT Chief Engineer shall act as the Governor's Representative for Highway Safety, pending Governor approval.

The Branch Manager of the Safety and Traffic Engineering Branch shall be responsible for coordination of the Transportation Safety and Traffic Engineering Branch activities in support of the Office of Transportation Safety. The Director of the Public Relations Office is designated as the office responsible for management and coordination of all media and public information safety campaigns and activities for the Office of Transportation Safety and traffic safety in general.

IMPLEMENTATION

This Procedural Directive shall become effective immediately upon adoption by the State Transportation Commission and shall be implemented by the Office of Transportation Safety.



Repeal Policy Directive No. 800.0 “State Highway Safety Agency”

WHEREAS, § 43-1-106 (8)(a) C.R.S. (2011) gives authority to the Transportation Commission of Colorado (“Commission”) to formulate the general policy with respect to the management, construction, and maintenance of public highways and other transportation systems in the state; and

WHEREAS, Policy Directive 800.0 was adopted by the Transportation Commission on November 1, 2006; and

WHEREAS, Policy Directive 800.0 “State Highway Safety Agency” may be repealed as it no longer accurately reflects the current structure of the Traffic and Safety Engineering Branch; and

WHEREAS, a Policy Directive is no longer necessary to establish the internal structure of the Traffic and Safety Engineering Branch; and

WHEREAS, eliminating this Policy Directive is part of CDOT's project to reduce the number of Policies and Procedural Directives and repeal any that are no longer necessary.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Commission herein repeals Policy Directive 800.0 “State Highway Safety Agency” dated November 1, 2006.
