

Site of Work and Trucking Roles Determination Worksheet (2025)

This optional document shall be used to assist the project team with the determination of whether a location is considered site of work and the type of trucking role(s) conducted in relation to the project. These determinations are essential for certified payroll/Davis-Bacon and Related Acts applicability. It is recommended that the following information is completed at the beginning of the project and updated as necessary. The USDOL site of work definition is found at <u>29 CFR 5.2</u>.

Section I. Site of Work

A. Source of Material

Complete the chart below identifying the source(s) of material that is being incorporated into the project. For example, asphalt, concrete, riprap, dirt, fill, millings.
