Jointed Goatgrass

(*Aegilops cylindrica*)

The Colorado Noxious Weed Act requires every landowner to **eradicate, contain or suppress this weed** wherever it is found on his or her property. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

Jointed goatgrass is a winter annual grass that grows up to 4 feet tall. Its leaf blades are up to 0.25 inch wide with hairs. It is similar to wheat in the seed stage, but the weed has occasional hairs extending from the margin of the leaf blade, particularly near the collar or stem. Also, unlike winter wheat, this weed's seedling has a spikelet attached to the root.
