A member of the figwort family, this plant is a perennial herb that grows to between 7 and 24 inches tall, with lavender to pale blue flowers that bloom from late May to June.

Habitat: This species grows in semi-barren areas on white (infrequently red) soils that are xeric, shallow, fine-textured, and frequently mixed with fragmented shale.
