TIPS FOR SHARING THE ROAD

Whether you're strolling to the farmer's market, driving to the bank or riding your bike to soak up some spectacular Colorado sunshine, be respectful of everyone's rights to our roadway.

MOTORISTS

- Focus on driving. Avoid using cell phones and other personal devices while driving.
- Keep your eye on cyclists and pedestrians. They have a right to use all the roads in Colorado unless expressly prohibited.
- Keep track of them in your rear and side mirrors.
- · Slow down.
- When passing a bicyclist, be sure to give at least 3 feet between your car and the bike.

PEDESTRIANS

- Cross in crosswalks. Pedestrians have the right of way at crosswalks and intersections.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing to ensure they see you.
- · Walk against traffic.

CYCLISTS

- Ride with the flow of traffic.
- Obey traffic laws-you're a vehicle too.
- To cross at a traffic signal that hasn't been triggered by a vehicle, go to the sidewalk and press the pedestrian push-button or bike indicator.
- Ride single file whenever possible.
