### **Legal Overview**

- 1. C.R.S. § 43-4-806
  - 1. CTIO is a "Type 1 Entity"
  - 2. Specific Powers of CTIO and its Board are enumerated in § (6) (a) (q); (7) (a) -(c); and(7.5)
- 2. C.R.S. § 43-4-809
  - 1. CTIO is Exempted Procurement Code and Rules.
- 3. 1 C.C.R. § 101-9
  - 1. CDOT Procurement Operates under Delegation of Purchasing Authority



#### Procurement Code Exemption Issues

- CDOT Procurement Purchasing Delegation
  - Under 1 C.C.R. § 109-1, Purchasing Delegation requires delegation agreement between CDOT and State Purchasing binding CDOT Procurement Officials to only conduct procurements in accordance with the State Procurement Code and Rules.
  - CTIO as a Type 1 Entity, utilizes CDOT Procurement Officials for purchasing and procurement.
  - CDOT Procurement Officials are not authorized to and could risk their procurement delegation by not following the State Procurement Code and Rules.
- Solution
  - Update CTIO Procurement Policy to better align with State Procurement Code and request approval from State Purchasing to expand CDOT Purchasing Delegation.



## Major Updates

- Establishment of Procurement Subcommittee
  - Dollar Value Threshold
- Inclusion of Additional Procurement Types
  - Requests for Expression of Interest; Request for Information;
- Threshold Increase
  - \$150,000 for Small Purchases; \$50,000 for Non-Competitive Procurements
- Procurement Remedies Clarification
- Incorporating Award Preferences From State Procurement Rules
