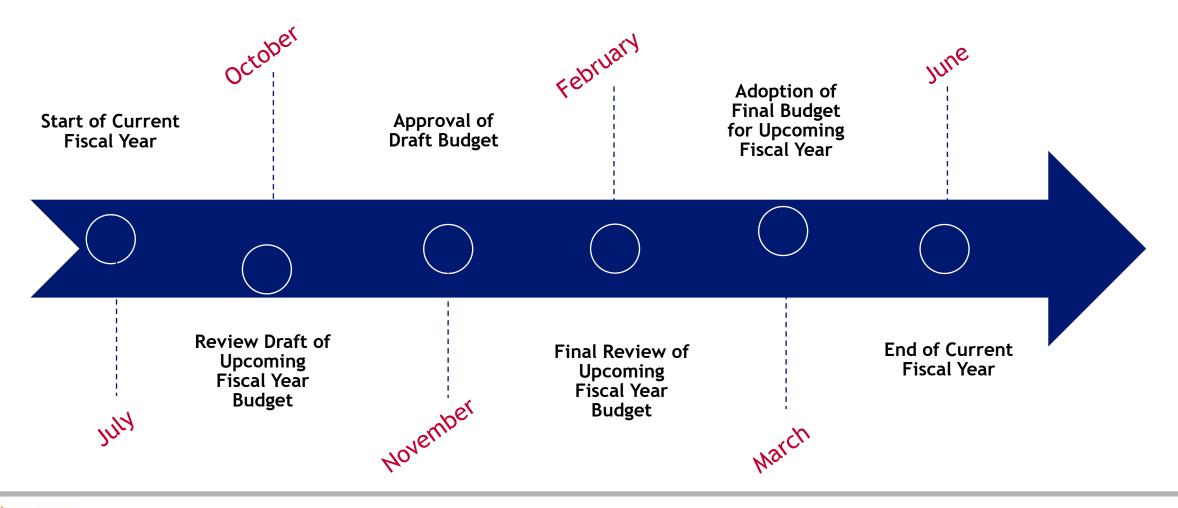

Fund 537: Operating Fund



Sources of Funding

- Intra Agency Agreement (IAA)
 Payments for Services
 - Annual Fee for Service IAA with CDOT
 - Project Specific IAA's, example: Floyd Hill
- Interest
- Unsolicited Proposal Fees





Uses of Funding

- A portion of administration and overhead
- Project development work as requested by CDOT
- Support for Express Lanes projects under construction
 - Staff time
 - Communications (telephone town halls)
 - Legal Services
- Tasks are requested by CDOT
 - Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) reporting requirements for Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER), Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD), and Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) grants received by CDOT



Key Areas of Work for Fiscal Year 2026-27

- Central 70 Contract oversight for the Central 70 Project Agreement.
 - monitor routine maintenance, snow and ice removal, and capital renewal and replacement (OMR) work provided for the entire corridor
- Reconnecting Communities Grant Support
- Communications and outreach on Express Lanes projects under development and construction
 - I-270

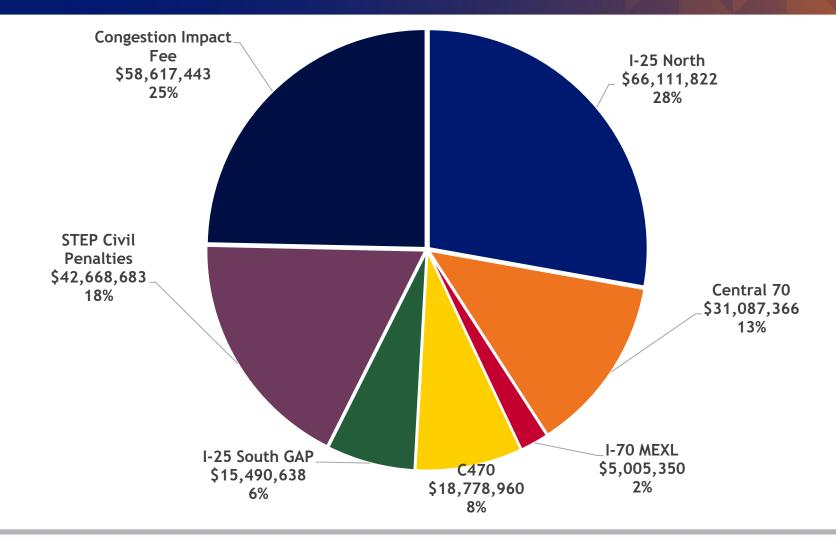
Sources of Revenue

- Interest





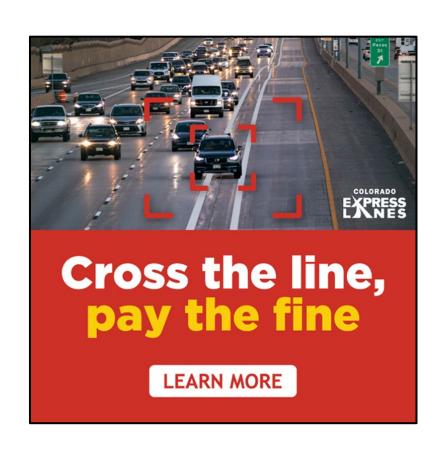
Revenue Estimates





Uses of Funding

- Express Lane Operations
 - Toll processing (including HOV transactions)
 - Transponders Sales (including sales tax processing)
 - Customer Service
 - Express Lanes Roadway and Equipment Maintenance
 - Staffing (contractors and internal)
 - Communications (STEP messaging, safety reminders, paid media)
- Debt Service
- Safety and Toll Enforcement Program Operations
- Implementation of Rail and Transit Projects





Key Items Still Outstanding

Potential Burnham Yard budgetary impacts beyond June 2026 Initial financial plan for Joint Service and anticipated CTIO allocation for FY27 Final costs for Mountain Rail starter service commencing in November 2026

New financing structure for MEXL and Floyd Hill

Budgetary impact of transition costs with E470



Next Steps

- Determine if a FY 2026-27 and Fee for Service Inter-Agency Agreement (IAA) between
 CTIO and CDOT is needed
- Update budget based on workplan progress for Mountain Rail and Joint Service
- Update revenue forecasts for both toll revenue and congestion impact fee
- Reflect any new operations costs for toll processing and tolling equipment maintenance
- Staff will return in February for with a final budget for review
