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One of the efforts undertaken by the Colorado Department of Transportation to protect water quality is the CDOT Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping Program. The purpose of this program is to manage, prevent and reduce polluted runoff from CDOT facilities. This type of program is a Best Management Practice (BMP) identified by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

CDOT's efforts include training its employees about the impacts associated with illegal discharges and improper disposal of waste from daily operations. They also include working to reduce or prevent stormwater pollution from facilities such as streets, roads, parking lots, maintenance and storage areas, snow disposal areas, waste transfer stations and other areas of new construction.



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
