



### Cultural Methods for Noxious Weed Control



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Cultural controls are one of the methods available to the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) for controlling the spread of noxious weeds along State Highway corridors. Cultural control methods involve manipulation of the environment by non-mechanical means such as controlled burning, grazing management, or revegetation programs.

For these approaches, timing is often critical. The goal is to attack the noxious weeds at a time when they are most vulnerable. The timing should also accommodate establishment of desired vegetation. The overall goal is to shift the competitive advantage from the noxious weeds to the desired species.

Burning and grazing are not generally compatible with highway safety, leaving revegetation as CDOT's primary control strategy.

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
