## **Sericea Lespedeza**

(*Lespedeza cuneata*)

The Colorado Noxious Weed Act requires every landowner to **eradicate this weed** wherever it is found on his or her property. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

This weed is a shrubby perennial legume that can grow to five feet tall. Stems are erect with stiff hairs. Leaves are divided into three smaller, linear leaflets. The leaflets are a green-gray to ashy color. Flowers emerge from the leaf axis (between the leaf and stem) and can be alone or in clusters of two to four. Flowers are white with violet or purple markings.
