









Dame's Rocket

(*Hesperis matronalis*)

The Colorado Noxious Weed Act requires every landowner to **eradicate, contain or suppress this weed** wherever it is found on his or her property. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

Dame's rocket is a biennial or short-lived perennial forb ranging from 4 inches to 3 feet tall at maturity. The flowers are white to purple with four petals and are clustered in loose terminal stalks. The cylindrically shaped fruits contain many seeds. The seed pods are about 1.5 inches long. Leaves are slightly hairy, alternate, and 2 to 4 inches long, lance-shaped with toothed margins.
