Eurasian watermilfoil is an AQUATIC plant that roots on the bottom, but spread as free floating plants waiting to take root. The leaves each have 12 to 21 pairs of leaflets and are 1 inch long. The plant is typically under water with stems to 12 feet long, becoming emerged only while flowering. The flowers are pinkish and whorled with emerged bract like leaves just below each whorl.
