Spurred Anoda

(Anoda cristata)

The Colorado Noxious Weed Act requires every landowner to **eradicate, contain or suppress this weed** wherever it is found on his or her property. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

Spurred anoda is a summer annual forb with a low growing, spreading profile. The leaves are 1.5 to 3 inches long, and triangular to arrow shaped. Mature leaves are coarsely toothed with three distinct lobes. Stems are erect, reaching 3.5 feet tall. They have branches at the base spreading up to 4 to 5 feet from taproot. The flowers are solitary. They are 0.25 to 0.5 inch wide, with 5 petals that are light blue to lavender.
