The Colorado Department of Agriculture encourages, but does not require, landowners to stop the continued spread of this invasive plant. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

Chicory is a perennial forb that grows 1 to 6 feet tall. Lower portions of stems are hairy. Upper portions are generally without leaves, making the stems appear straggly. Each flower head consists of many individual, bright blue, petal-like flowers that are squared-ended and toothed. The leaves are large (2 to 6 inches long) at the bottom of the plant, but small on the upper stems.
