(Halogeton glomeratus)

The Colorado Department of Agriculture (CDA) encourages, but does not require, landowners to stop the continued spread of this invasive plant. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

Halogeton is an annual forb that grows 3 to 12 inches tall. Its stems are red when young, turning yellow to white with maturity. They are branched from the base, spreading first, and then growing vertical. The leaves are simple, fleshy and tubular. They are bluish-green with a small hair at the end. The plant is poisonous, especially to sheep.
