





Redstem Filaree

(*Erodium cicutarium*)

The Colorado Department of Agriculture (CDA) encourages, but does not require, landowners to stop the continued spread of this invasive plant. The Colorado Department of Transportation controls these weeds on its right-of-way.

Redstem filaree is a winter annual or biennial forb that can grow from 3 inches to 2 feet tall. The stems are hairy and red. The leaves are opposite and finely divided with toothed or lobed margins, and have a reddish tint. The five-petaled flowers are a purplish-pink and are in clusters of 2 or more. Each flower will produce 5 long-lobed fruits.
