Colorado status: Endangered

This mammal has the elongate body shape and short legs with a black facial mask, feet, and legs. The moderately long tail is tipped with black. It is generally yellow buff, paler around the face, abdomen, and throat, and darker brown down the top of the head and back. The ears are conspicuous and rounded.
