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Federal status: Candidate for listing
Colorado status: Threatened

Mostly brown in color with horizontal barring and short, rounded tails, this bird is about the size of a small domestic chicken. Males have red-purple air sacs on the sides of their necks that inflate during courtship displays in spring.

Habitat: This species prefers sandy grassland areas that have an abundance of midgrasses, sandsage and yucca. It is found in 7 counties of eastern Colorado: Baca, Bent, Cheyenne, Crowley Kiowa, Lincoln and Prowers.

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
