Pallid Sturgeon (*Scaphirhynchus albus*)

The pallid sturgeon is one of the largest fishes found in the Missouri-Mississippi River drainage, with adults reaching 2.5 to 5 feet in length weighing up to 85 pounds. It is usually light brown on the dorsal surface and white underneath. It has a flattened, shovel-shaped snout.

Habitat: This fish is found from the headwaters of the Missouri River (Fort Benton-Great Falls, Montana) through the Mississippi River to New Orleans, Louisiana.

This species is not found in Colorado. However, water depletion from the Platte River drainage in Colorado and other states will contribute to its decline in rivers downstream. This is a potential issue for 22 counties in northern Colorado
