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Boreal Toad (*Bufo boreas boreas*)

Federal status: Not listed
Colorado status: Endangered

Female boreal toads may reach 4.3 inches long, while males seldom exceed 3.7 inches. Adults have warty green to gray skin, and the warts can have a reddish color. Juveniles tend to have redder coloring. Boreal toads often have a distinctive light mid-dorsal stripe, which may be more prominent in females.

Habitat: In Colorado, this species is found only in areas with suitable breeding habitat in spruce-fir forests and alpine meadows. Breeding habitat includes lakes, marshes, ponds, and bogs with sunny exposures and quiet, shallow water. The species is found at elevations of 7,500 to 12,000 feet in at least 23 western Colorado counties.



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
