Colorado status: Not listed

This low, rounded plant arises from a woody taproot. It is a sub-shrub, with branches spreading wider than they grow tall. It reaches a height of about 5 inches and a width of 16 inches. Its flowers are white to cream colored, blooming in June and July. It has numerous woody branches from which bark hangs off in loose strips.

Habitat: This species grows only on the adobe badlands of western Colorado. The entire global range of this wildflower is limited to fewer than 500 acres in Montrose and Delta counties.
