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North Park Phacelia (*Phacelia formosula*)

Federal status: Endangered
Colorado status: Not listed

This perennial plant, a member of the snapdragon family, can grow to ten inches in height. It has many stiff hairs on branching or single, upright stems. The leaves are highly divided and the purple flowers bloom from July to August.

Habitat: This species grows on barren, raw exposures of the Coalmont Formation, a rusty-colored sandy substrate. It is most abundant on the steepest, most sparsely vegetated, and most erodible slopes, such as on the sides of deeply cut ravines. It is found in Colorado's Jackson and Larimer counties.



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
