

Why Express Lanes? The Answer is Simple: Choice.

Express Lanes are always built adjacent to existing general purpose lanes and offer roadway users the choice to pay a toll, use transit or carpool for a more reliable trip. On CDOT's Express Lane corridors, travelers in all lanes (including the general purpose lanes) see time savings of anywhere from 20% to 50%. By offering choices, Express Lanes help to reduce delays, manage congestion and keep travel times reliable for motorists.

I-25 South Gap from Monument to Castle Rock

The Gap is an 18-mile stretch of Interstate 25 from Monument to south of Castle Rock connecting Colorado's two largest cities, Denver and Colorado Springs. With population growth over the years, the need for higher travel capacity has grown as well. These Express Lanes provide much needed relief to the corridor.

Corridor Basics

- 18 miles on I-25 from Monument to south of Castle Rock.
- Lanes will be open 24/7.
- Overhead signage indicates current toll prices. Tolls are collected through ExpressToll account or License Plate Toll.
- Free carpool, free motorcycle, bus and toll options are available.
- Carpoolers must have a Switchable HOV Transponder to use the Express Lanes for free.

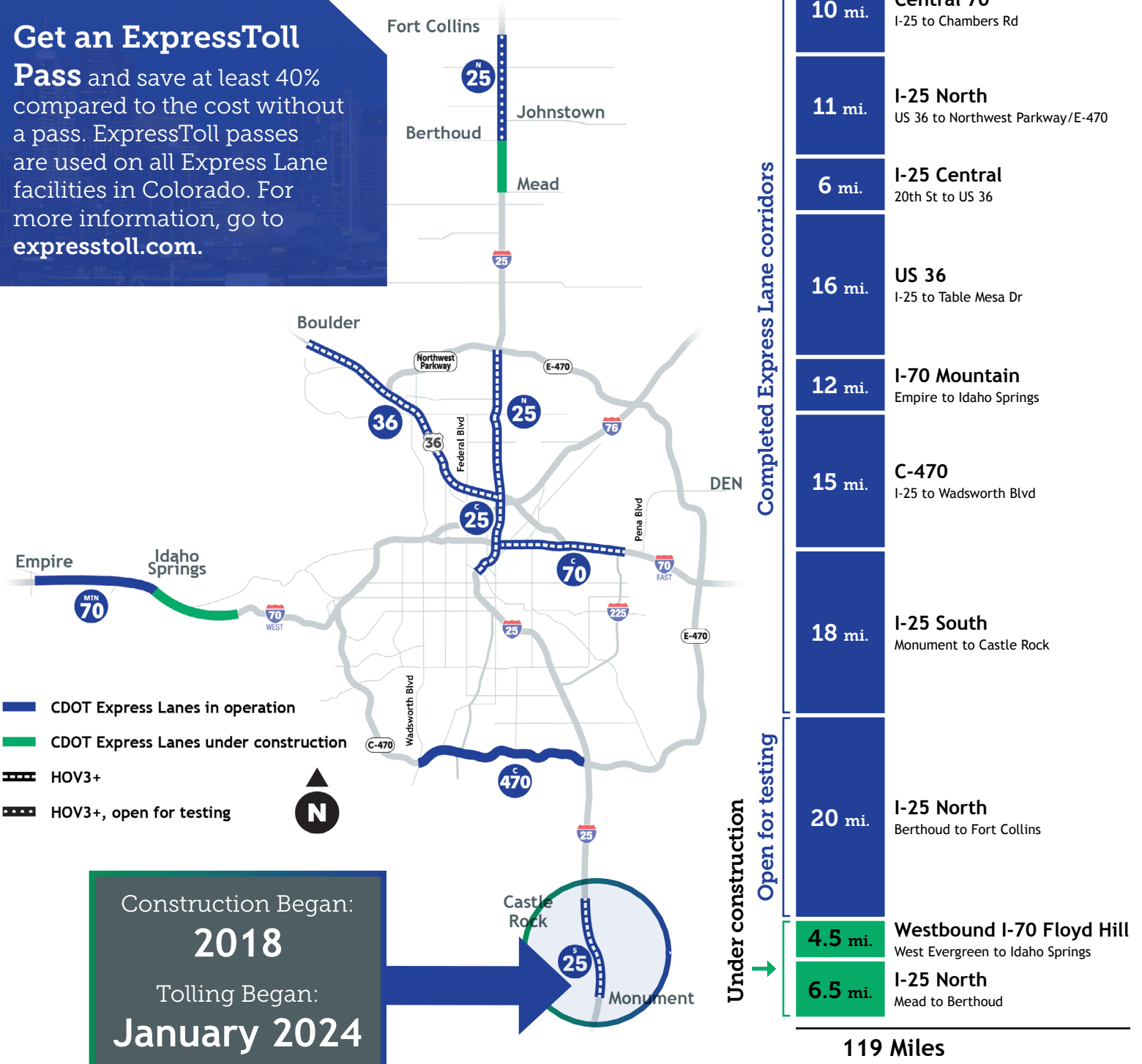
