Transit piece for 4P packet

FASTER is providing CDOT with \$5 million per year for a local transit grant program. The Colorado Transportation Commission is considering options for how to distribute these funds. The highest consideration is being given to allocating the funds to the CDOT Regions and having the Regions develop a list of projects for the STIP in cooperation with the TPRs. The final decision has not yet been made but CDOT is proceeding with this regional allocation and selection process in advance of a final Transportation Commission decision, given that some 4P County Hearings will be held soon.

Under this regional allocation proposal, transit operators and others are being advised to briefly inform their appropriate county commissioners and TPR representatives of any eligible capital projects for 2010-2017 for which they are seeking FASTER funds. This means county commissioners, TPR representatives and other local officials may soon be receiving phone calls and emails from transit operators requesting funds for capital projects—something that has rarely happened in the past. 4P local officials are asked to indicate during the County Hearing process which particular transit projects are "worthy of further consideration." The CDOT Regions will then inform the projects identified as "worthy of further consideration" to submit a brief, one-page project summary to CDOT. During the STIP development process, the CDOT Regions, in cooperation with the TPRs, will priority rank all the eligible transit projects from that CDOT Region and develop a STIP transit list for 2010-2017 within their regional allocation.

SUBJECT: Allocation of HIRE Funds

The CDOT Executive Management is presenting five scenarios for use of additional funds as a result of HIRE.

- 1. The first scenario was developed based on requests from individual Commissioners regarding specific project funding needs. The specifics of the requests are listed on the attached spreadsheet under "Project Specific Scenario".
- 2. The second scenario emphasizes surface treatment with ½ of the funds going towards this program.
- 3. The third scenario emphasizes 7th Pot with over 60% of the funds going towards this program.
- 4. The fourth scenario would be distributed based on regional needs. The region and its planning partners could determine whether the funds go to 7th pot, surface, or RPP type projects.
- 5. The fifth scenario is identical to the fourth scenario with the exception of \$30 million being set aside for maintenance needs.
