**SUBJECT**: FY 13, 1<sup>st</sup> Budget Workshop

On August 17<sup>th</sup>, we will have the first budget workshop for FY 13. This workshop is designed to reacquaint everyone with the revenue picture past and present, the current status of the FY 12 approved budget and a couple of scenarios for FY 13.

As you all know, the revenue picture on both the federal is still unclear. Current federal transportation funding expires at the end of September. Although there are bills being circulated, it is very possible that we will have little more clarity regarding federal funding for the balance of the year prior to the November commission meeting at which the draft budget must be adopted.

We have weathered the FY11 rescission with no impact to the federal funding available to Colorado. This has been the case each year of which I am aware, including FY10, which had the potential to affect funding but was reversed. Therefore, it is not suggested that we have a contingency item for this, as was considered in past years.

On the state side, vehicle registration and fuel revenues are currently stable, though trending downward slightly. We are no longer predicting that SB 09-228 funding will be available in FY13, which is not likely a surprise. As was the case last year, given the current General Fund shortfall, we simply hope to avoid the possibility that the Legislature may seek to identify additional programs where it can shift costs from the General Fund to the HUTF.

I am sending a document that illustrates actual revenues for FY 11, the budgeted revenues for FY 12 and the Resource Allocation planning numbers from the 2035 amendment for FY 13. By the time of the workshop, we will have added the current revenue projections from our revenue model, tailored to match the more conservative transportation bill currently be circulated, which calls for SAFETEA-LU type allocations, but at a level which does not deplete the Highway Trust Fund. At the workshop, you will have the opportunity to discuss revenue assumptions, so that in September, I can show you how these affect the allocations among programs.

At the September meeting, Staff Branch managers will be reporting on performance measures and funding levels for Maintenance Levels of Service, Surface Treatment, and On-System Bridge. At that time, I will work with you on the direction you'd like to set for the CDOT programs in the FY13 Budget. Then, in October, I will present the draft budget, per your direction, for any final adjustments before the November approval of the draft budget. Then, in the spring, we will review the draft and upon your approval, send it to the Governor for his signature. I am sending a schedule of these activities as well.

We currently presume that the Transportation Commission will want to discuss the following programs and funding allocations through the budget process. These are in addition to the roll forwards and decision items:

- Maintenance, including Road Equipment
- Surface Treatment
- Bridge
- Regional Priority Programs
- Transportation Commission Contingency

If there are other programs you wish to discuss, such as rock fall mitigation, as part of this process please let me know and we will make arrangements to provide the data for an informed discussion.

In addition, there will be a presentation of FY13 Decision Items. These are items that have been reviewed by the Senior Management Team for your consideration for funding in the FY13 Budget. When considering these items a key element will be the discussion of where to find the funds to pay for them if the Commission considers them appropriate to fund.

In addition, we have some final issues to take care of from FY 11. A workshop will focus on the presentation of FY11 unspent, or "roll forward" funds as well as requests for special projects to utilize a portion thereof. These items, too, have been reviewed by the Senior Management Team and approved to be sent to you for your consideration.
