Colorado legislation requires the allocation of funds in proportion to the geographic distribution of $\mathrm{K}-8$ student population. This equates to allocating approximately $75 \%$ of the funds to urban areas and $25 \%$ to rural areas based upon 2005-2007 American Community Survey data. CDOT averages this across funding years to assure that all selected projects are fully funded rather than awarding partial funding to a project to meet the percentages exactly each year.
