SURVEY PURPOSE


Learn about travel behavior and characteristics of **older adults** (65 years or older) and **persons with disabilities** (18 years or older)

Determine their transportation priorities, needs and preferences

Identify gaps and barriers

Inform the planning process

DESCRIPTION OF THE QUESTIONNAIRE



SURVEY ADMINISTRATION

TWO APPROACHES:

MAILING LIST

- Surveys mailed to 4,000 randomly selected households across 15 TPRs
- 2/3 older adults (age 65+)
- 1/3 adults with disabilities



1,190 completed (30%)

AGENCY-DISTRIBUTED

- Surveys given to Colorado agencies serving older adults and adults with disabilities
- Agencies distributed surveys to clientele in hard copy (6,746) and email

998 completed hard copy(15%)
+ 925 completed online








DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE OF RESPONDENTS

FORMS OF TRANSPORTATION




TRANSPORTATION DEPENDENCY




FUTURE USE OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Distance from stop too far to walk


Difficulty accessing stops in poor

BARRIERS TO PARATRANSIT USE
