CDOT's Wounded Warrior Program was implemented in August 2010 with a focus on helping wounded veterans who were unemployed or unable to return to the job they had before serving in combat find opportunity through CDOT to restart their working lives, build business relationships and improve their work skills.

Travis was recently offered and accepted a job with the Colorado Department of Corrections (DOC) and will be starting their academy. After completion of the academy Travis will be working at the Denver facility for DOC.

Travis Enlisted in the United States Marine Corps. just out of high school in 1998. Within his eight years of service he served two tours in Iraq and received multiple medals (Including a Naval/Marine Corps Achievement Medal for Valor in Combat and a Combat Action Ribbon) and fulfilled his obligation to the Marines as a Sergeant/E-5 in July of 2006.

Travis holds a Bachelors of Arts in Sociology with a minor in Social Work and has been a guest speaker at Juvenile Delinquency classes helping facilitate change in troubled youth.
