

CDOT Wounded Warrior Hires on at National Park Service

Stephen "Steve" Stewart was a Staff Sergeant (E-6) in the US Army when he volunteered for duty in Afghanistan in 2007. He held a position of Casualty Officer for the Joint Logistics Center in Bagram, Afghanistan and pulled guard duty while working alongside Clear Teams dealing with fallen comrade ceremonies.

His deployment to Afghanistan was cut short due to a mortar shell hitting next to his sleeping quarters in May of 2007, resulting in him being medevac'd (Medically Evacuated) out of Afghanistan.

In all Steve completed seventeen years and ten months with the Army before being medically retired.

Steve was assigned to the Army Wounded Warrior Program (AW2) in Fort Carson, Colorado and was referred to the CDOT Wounded Warrior Program in August of 2010. He was hired on at CDOT January 3, 2011, in Region 2/Planning and Environmental Division under Lisa Streisfeld, Regional Planning and Environmental Manager (Pictured below). Steve has thoroughly enjoyed his time here at CDOT working within the Water Quality Program for the Region. Unfortunately for CDOT Steve was offered and accepted a full time position with the National Park Service starting March 28, 2011.

Steve is currently working on a Master's Degree in Science Management with Concentration in IT/Project Management (December 2011). He also holds a Graduate Certificate in Environmental Health Sciences and a Bachelors of Science in Business Administration.
