










Traffic Phasing

Temporary Trail Detours

Mary Carter Greenway Trail



Western detour: Follow the Columbine Trail along Chatfield Avenue and Platte Canyon Road. Take the Mineral Trail along Mineral Avenue to connect back onto Mary Carter Greenway Trail. Detour is approximately 3.2 miles, which is .3 miles longer than original route for eastbound to northbound users.

Eastern detour: Follow the Highline Canal Trail to Southpark Lane. Take the Mineral Avenue Trail. After crossing Santa Fe Drive, continue on the Railroad Spur Trail back onto Mary Carter Greenway Trail. Detour is approximately 3 miles, which is 1 mile shorter than original route for westbound to northbound users.


- Duration: max 6 months cumulative
- Western Detour Length: 3.2 miles
- Eastern Detour Length: 3 miles

Clockwise from the closure (red X), this detour uses the C-470 Trail to Erickson Boulevard, then County Line Road to Primo Road, back to the High Line Canal Trail.


- Detour: Q4 2017

Clockwise from the closure (red X) this detour follows Park Meadows Drive to Acres Green Drive, then Parkway Drive back to Willow Creek Trail.

- Detour: Q2 2018
- Duration: 1-2 months



- •Water trucks used for dust suppression





Water Quality

- •Stormwater runoff in a construction site can affect water quality through erosion and sedimentation.
- Stormwater controls, or Best Management Practices (BMPs), must be in place and working properly at all times, as required by the project permit, local, state, and federal laws and regulations.



Wildlife Protection

•Wildlife may be present during project activities, including species of concern and species which are protected under state and Federal laws or regulations.

Why Express Lanes?


- CDOT/HPTE new focus on:
 - Increased choice in travel
 - Increased mobility through operational improvements
- Reduce congestion on critical corridors
- Use toll pricing to manage congestion
- Maintain reliable travel times now and in the future

How to Use Express Lanes

- "Get a Pass" Drivers will save money every time by paying the toll only with an Express Toll account and pass.
- Visit expresstoll.com or call 303-537-3470 to get yours today.
- Express Toll pass works on all CDOT Express Lanes, the Northwest Parkway and E-470.
- Switchable HOV Transponders will work in toll mode on C-470 Express Lanes. As a reminder, C-470 will not have a free HOV carpool option.







Trip Reliability

Travelers are never forced to pay a toll and can always choose to travel in the adjacent free general purpose lanes.





NE wall #1 at Chatfield elevation


























NE wall #7 at Shadow Canyon elevation


