

Slow overnight traffic expected on I-25 at 6th Avenue March 9 – 13

What: Crews will be working during the overnight hours to demolish a portion of the US 6 bridge that crosses over I-25.

When: The nights of Sunday, March 9, through Thursday, March 13, from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. each night

Details: Southbound I-25 traffic will be diverted off of I-25 at US 6 and northbound I-25 traffic will be shifted over into the southbound lanes while crews remove the east portion of the bridge deck. Traffic in both directions of I-25 will be narrowed down to a single lane before 6th Avenue.

Drivers on I-25 should plan for heavy traffic and delays, starting at about 9:30 p.m. and continuing until midnight each night.

Alternate Routes:

Northbound regional through traffic should avoid this area altogether if possible by using C-470/E-470 or I-225 to I-70.

Northbound local traffic can take Santa Fe Drive north to 8th Avenue and then go west on 8th Avenue to reconnect with I-25.

Southbound regional through traffic should avoid the area by taking I-70 to either C-470 on the west or I-225 on the east.

Southbound local traffic can exit at Colfax Avenue or 8th Avenue to avoid the detour.



The US 6 Bridges Design-Build Project involves improvements along 6th Avenue from approximately Knox Court on the west through the BNSF railroad track bridge just east of I-25. The project, which was part of the I-25 Valley Highway FEIS completed in 2006, includes building new bridges over Bryant Street, the South Platte River, BNSF railroad tracks, I-25, and over US 6 at Federal Boulevard and Knox Court, as well as improvements to Barnum Parks and a realigned off-ramp from northbound I-25 to westbound US 6. Substantial project completion is planned for August 2015.
