ENVIRONMENTAL CONSEQUENCES

MITIGATION

Parks and Recreation

These resources include recreational facilities such as Chatfield State Park, South Platte Park, golf courses, and the High Line Canal trail.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSEQUENCES

No-Action

- Increased noise levels in parks immediately adjacent to C-470
- Congested conditions on C-470 would make access to parks more difficult and time consuming

General Purpose Lanes

- Increased noise levels at Chatfield State Park
- Eliminated southbound right-in, right-out access to Chatfield from Santa Fe
- Improved signal timing provides better access to Chatfield at Blakeland/Santa Fe intersection
- Retaining walls along northern border of Chatfield State Park
- Lengthened High Line Canal trail culvert under C-470
- Acquisition of 0.16 acres at Links Golf Course

Tolled Express Lanes (Preferred Alternative)

- Increased noise levels at Chatfield State Park
- Eliminated southbound right-in, right-out access to Chatfield from Santa Fe
- Improved signal timing provides better access to Chatfield at Blakeland/Santa Fe intersection
- Retaining walls along northern border of Chatfield
- Lengthened High Line Canal trail culvert under C-470
- Acquisition of 0.19 acres at Links Golf Course

MITIGATION

- Detour routes for High Line Canal trail during culvert extension construction; trail would remain open
- Trail detour information posted and presented to trail user groups in advance of detour activity
- Avoid and minimize acquisition of Links Golf Course
- Compensate golf course owners for their land value during property acquisition process
- Tiered construction on largest retaining wall to provide visual break in wall height
- Retaining wall textures and colors will blend with existing landscape



Right of Way (ROW)

ROW is the land on which a highway is constructed including ramps, medians, drainage ditches, and land adjacent to the highway used for highway related purposes.

- Coordinate with property owners during final design to keep them informed of the property acquisition process
- Compensate property owners for their land value during property acquisition process
