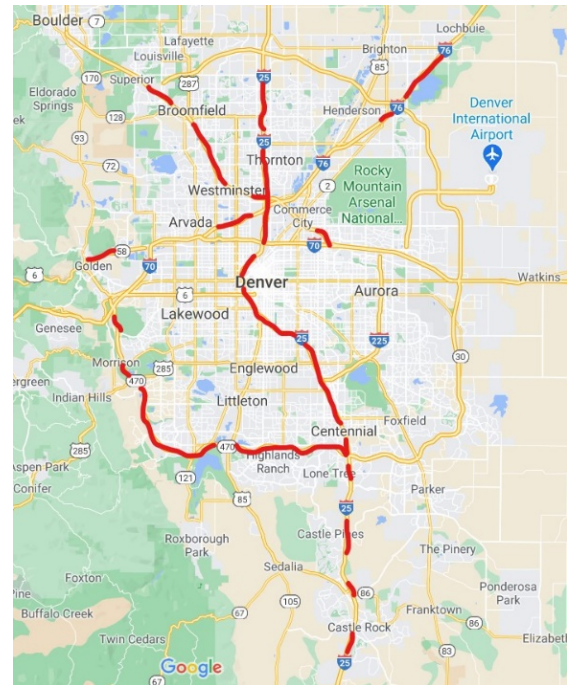

— PROJECT COMPLETION — CDOT completes Phase II of Wrong-Way Signage Improvements Project

DENVER METRO AREA — The Colorado Department of Transportation, in partnership with CEC Infrastructure Group, LLC, has officially completed replacing and upgrading wrong-way signage which began in early January this year. Work took place along multiple highways and interstates throughout the metro area, as well as six different counties including: Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Denver, Douglas, and Jefferson.

Throughout the second phase of the sign replacement project, new signs were installed on all off ramps in the Denver metro area. The working area was widespread as signs were changed along I-25, SH 470, SH 58, I-70, I-76, and US 36. Road work and travel impacts were very minimal.

The project has greatly improved the public's safety by more effectively preventing drivers from entering the freeway in the wrong direction. Newer and much larger signs were installed in place of the current signs, to more easily catch the attention of drivers before entering a highway driving the wrong direction. Additionally, the new signs sit lower to the ground, and have red reflective tape on the post to indicate a wrong direction to the driver. There are also more signs on the ramps now than there were before the project.
