





Crews have completed the Edwards Spur Road Project! CDOT, Eagle County and the Edwards Metro District partnered to make improvements to Edwards Spur Road, an approximate 0.6-milelong stretch that connects I-70 to US 6 in the unincorporated town of Edwards. After two years of construction, crews widened roads and bridges, installed a roundabout and improved pedestrian mobility. Existing three-span Eagle River Bridge was removed and replaced with single-span river bridge along with removing existing piers from the river. This was accomplished at a lower cost than the original budget to just widen the existing bridge, which would have expanded on existing piers in the river.
