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#### INTRODUCTION

This report contains information regarding traffic volumes and lane usage, bus travel times, revenues and expenditures, law enforcement activities, and incidents which may have impacted operations or revenues during the month of December 2008.

#### 1.0 VOLUMES AND LANE USAGE

During December 2008, recorded use of the I-25 HOV/Express Lanes (including both HOV and toll-paying vehicles), increased to 282,616. This represents an 8.97% increase from 259,350 in November and a near match to 282,567 in October. Traffic during the holiday weeks was considerably lower than during the first three weeks of the month.

The highest traffic volume recorded since opening was in October 2007, at 355,308.

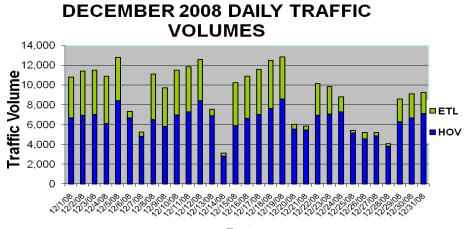

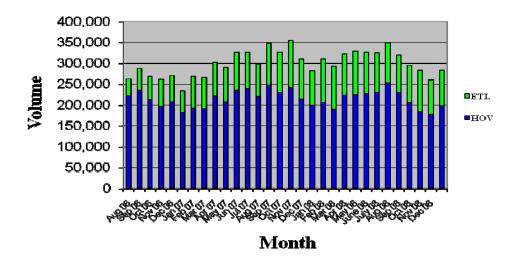

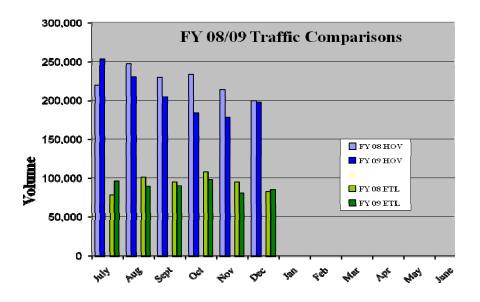


## MONTHLY TRAFFIC VOLUMES

HOV lane usage during December 2008 increased to 197,620, from 178,694 in November. This amount is down from 199,136 in December 2007 and represents a decline of 1,516, or .76%.

Toll lane usage during December 2008 increased to 84,996, from 80,656 in November. This amount is up from 83,022 in December 2007 and represents an increase of 1,974, or 2.38%.

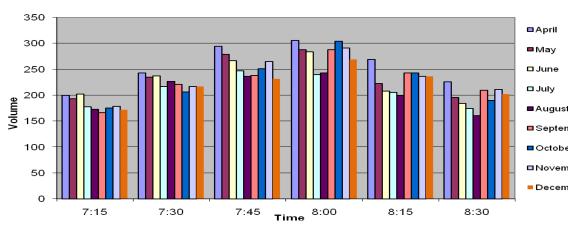

#### 2.0 BUS TRAVEL TIMES

The IGA between CDOT and RTD prescribes triggers to determine if there is any degradation to travel times for buses and carpools. These triggers are:

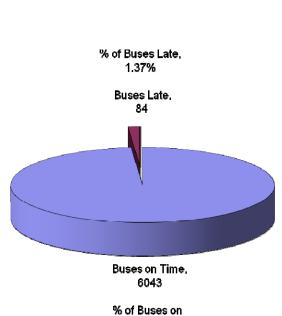
- Exceeding travel time for more than one bus in an hour (provided the excess is not attributable to a stall, crash and closure of the lane, or special event).
- Exceeding the travel time for more than one day per week for three weeks in a row.
- Predictable patterns.

December was a difficult month for bus delays, with eighty-four buses exceeding the 8-minute 45-second timeline. Of these, sixty-seven were delays directly related to snow on December 4<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>. There were also three hundred and twelve buses that ran between the 7-minute 45-second and 8-minute 45-second timelines, again with the majority delayed due to weather. According to RTD Dispatch, there were no backups for non-weather related issues.

The remaining bus delays were scattered over the AM and PM rush hours with some even occurring during the non-rush hour periods.

Bus delays are depicted in the chart below.



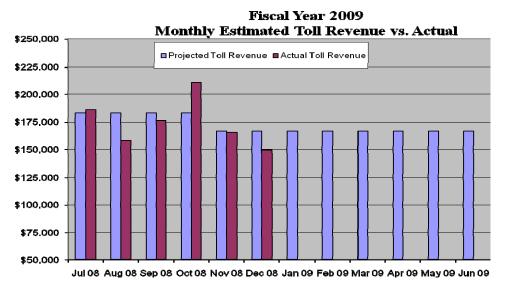

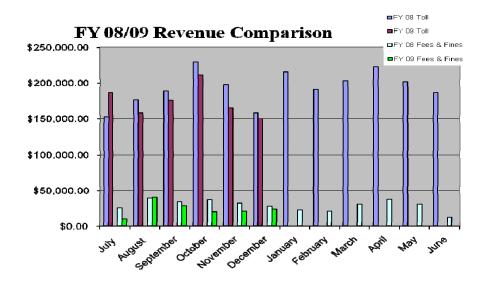
#### 3.0 REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

December 2008 toll revenues decreased to \$149,308.50; down from \$165,488.50 in November. The total of all revenues, including tolls, fees, and fines, was \$172,698.82. Fees and fines collected this month increased to \$23,390.32; up from 20,542.75 in November. The amount of fees and fines collected in December represents 13.54% of December's total revenues. (Reminder: Some revenues that were posted may have been transactions, fees, and fines reconciled from previous months' transactions.)
