



I-76 over Clear Creek Scour Mitigation

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Starting on Friday, Nov. 4 and lasting until early spring 2023, the Colorado Department of Transportation and contract partner Zak Dirt will begin a state-funded bridge scour mitigation project in Adams County. Work includes removing scour from the piers of twin bridge structures on Interstate 76 over Clear Creek and deflecting river water to the center of the channel under the bridges.

Erosion of the soil around a bridge foundation is frequently referred to as bridge scour which can over time lead to bridge failure. To manage the risk of bridge failure, countermeasures are used to mitigate scour effects.

PROJECT LOCATION

The project is located in Adams County at I-76 over Clear Creek, between Federal Blvd (US 287) and Lowell. The project limits extend from Mile Point 2.5 to Mile Point 3.0.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

The project begins on Friday, Nov. 4 and will last until early spring 2023. Working hours are 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Friday. Some Saturday work is expected.

TRAFFIC, PEDESTRIAN & CYCLIST IMPACTS

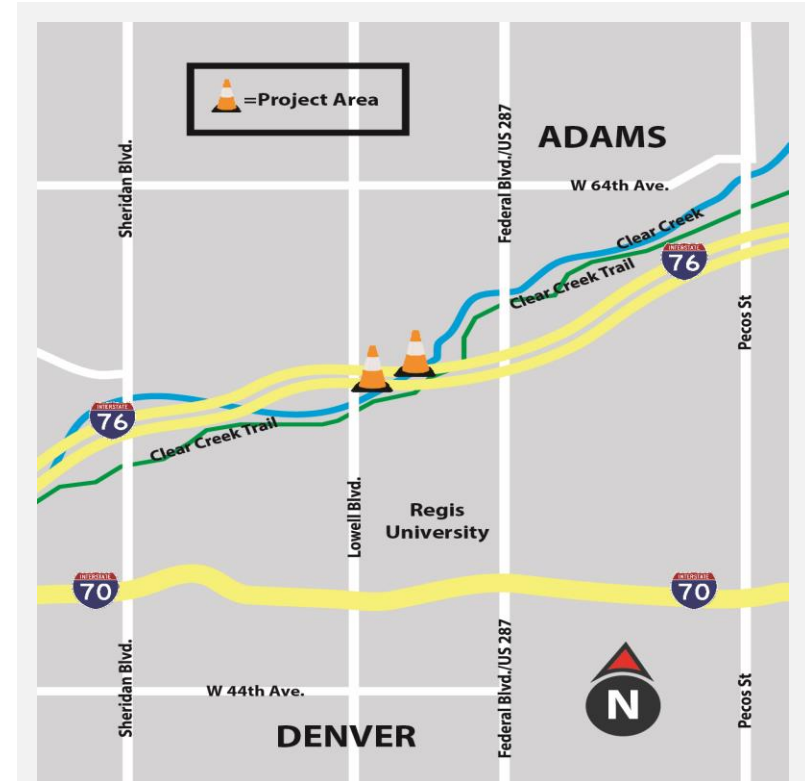
No traffic impacts are expected on I-76, but some path narrowing will exist during certain work activities on the Clear Creek Trail that runs adjacent to the river. Flaggers will be present during this work to ensure the safety of pedestrian and cyclist traffic.

CONTACT INFORMATION

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CDOT will begin a scour mitigation project on twin bridge structures on I-76 over Clear Creek in Adams County on Friday, Nov. 4. Work will be performed on the bridge piers (underwater) during daytime hours with no impacts to vehicular traffic on I-76. Intermittent narrowing of the Clear Creek Trail will exist, managed by flaggers.

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
