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Executive Summary

Background

- As a part of the North I-25 Environmental Impact Statement (North I-25 EIS), National Research Center, Inc. was contracted to conduct a household travel survey of residents within the study area. The study area includes I-25 corridor between the Fort Collins-Wellington area and Denver.
- Some transportation information exists which covers the study area, but transportation planners felt more information was needed about the "special trips" and "long trips" made by residents in the corridor. The survey primarily was focused on determining study area residents' trip-making behavior for these types of trips. The trips referred to in the report are round-trips; trips to and from a destination.

Methods

- A random sample of 10,000 residential mailing addresses from zip codes in the study area was selected for the North I-25 EIS Household Travel Study. The households were chosen such that 5,000 came from the northern portion of the study area (roughly north of Highway 66), and 5,000 came from the southern portion of the study area. Surveys were mailed in March of 2005.
- The 95 percent confidence level for the survey is generally no greater than plus or minus 1.7 percentage points around any given percent reported for the entire sample (3,152 completed interviews). The margin of error around results from the northern or southern portion of the study area is 2.5 percentage points.
- Survey results were weighted so that respondent tenure, age, gender and location of the resident's household were represented in the proportions reflective of the entire study area.
- Open ended responses and "other" responses appear verbatim in Appendix IV: Verbatim Responses to Survey Questions.

Travel for Any Purpose on Interstate 25

Travel for All Trips

- The total number of round trips made to each destination was calculated by summing the number of trips made for sporting events, cultural or special events, social/recreation trips, work or school commute trips and work-related trips. The average number of total weekday round trips made to each location by those who lived in the northern portion of the study area was:

 - Boulder or Longmont, 50
 - Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley (including the Budweiser Center), 375

Opinions about Traveling North I-25

- When asked if they regularly avoid traveling on I-25, just under half of respondents (46%) reported doing so. Of those who reported avoiding I-25, the reasons given included:
 - Too much congestion, 82%
 - I don't feel safe, 46%
 - It takes longer, 28%
 - Other, 29%

Familiarity with the North I-25 EIS Study

- Residents responding to the survey were asked if they had heard of the North I-25 EIS Study before taking the survey. Approximately three-quarters of respondents (76%) said they had not heard of it. About a quarter of those completing the questionnaire had been aware of the Study previous to receiving the mailed survey.
- When asked where they had heard of it, the proportion giving each response was:
 - Newspaper articles, 50%
 - Television, 29%
 - Word of Mouth, 16%
 - Radio, 11%
 - Public community meetings, 5%
 - Council/Commission meeting, 3%
 - Committee meetings, 1%

Report of Results

Survey Background

As a part of the North I-25 Environmental Impact Statement (North I-25 EIS), National Research Center, Inc. was contracted to conduct a household travel survey of residents within the study area. The North I-25 Study area includes the I-25 corridor between the Fort Collins-Wellington area and Denver. (Figure 1 on the next page shows a map of the study area.) Some transportation information exists which covers the study area, but transportation planners felt more information was needed about the "special trips" and "long trips" made by residents in the corridor. The survey primarily was focused on determining study area residents' trip-making behavior for these types of trips.

A random sample of 10,000 residential mailing addresses from zip codes in the study area was selected for the North I-25 EIS Household Travel Study. If a zip code was partially included in the study area, all addresses within the zip code were considered potential survey recipients. The study area was roughly divided (by whole zip codes) into a north and south area, using Highway 66 as the divider. According to the 2000 Census, 123,498 households were contained within the zip codes in the north part of the study area, and 256,858 in the south area.

The households were chosen for the survey such that 5,000 came from the northern portion of the study area (roughly north of Highway 66), and 5,000 came from the southern portion of the study area.


Each selected households received three mailings beginning in March, 2005. The first contact was a prenotification postcard, followed a week later by a survey accompanied by a cover letter signed by the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) project manager. A second wave of the survey was sent another week later, with a reminder cover letter. Completed surveys were collected over the following four weeks.

The cover letter to the survey contained the household address, so that results can be mapped in a Geographic Information System (GIS) to allow transportation planners to more clearly identify transportation patterns within the study area. Results will only be shown only at the group level, and respondents' information held confidential.

Approximately two weeks after the second wave of the survey, reminder calls were placed to just over 3,000 households who had not yet responded (and for which a phone number could be looked up).

About 5% of the surveys were returned because they either had incorrect addresses or were vacant. Of the 9,536 eligible households, 3,152 completed the survey, providing a response rate of 33%.

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Report of Results

Survey results were weighted so that respondent tenure (whether the respondent rented or owned his/her own home), age, gender and location of the resident's household (north or south of Highway 66) were represented in the proportions reflective of the entire study area. Thus, while the questionnaires were distributed such that half went to those north of Highway 66 and half to those south of Highway 66, the actual proportion of households in the zip codes assigned to the study area north of Highway 66, according to the 2000 Census, was 32%, while 68% were in the zip codes south of Highway 66. The figures for "all respondents" displayed in the graphs and tables in this report are weighted to reflect the actual population proportions.

Confidence Intervals

It is customary to describe the precision of estimates made from surveys by a "level of confidence" (or margin of error). The 95 percent confidence level for the survey is generally no greater than plus or minus 1.7 percentage points around any given percent reported for the entire sample (3,152 completed interviews). The over sampling of the southern portion of the study area allows results from that area to have the same precision as results from the northern portion. The margin of error around results from the northern or southern portion of the study area is 2.5 percentage points.

(For more information on the survey methodology, see Appendix V: Survey Methodology. Copies of the survey materials can be found in Appendix VI: Survey Materials.)

One minor note: due to rounding, the reader may find that some percents do not add exactly to 100%.

Calculating the Average Number of Trips per Respondent

Survey participants were asked about how often in the past year they made different types of trips in or through the study area. Broad categories of frequency rates were used. In order to make point estimates of the number of trips made per respondent per year, the following numbers of trips were assigned to each category:

For the survey questions, respondents were asked about travel to a destination, with the travel to return from the destination implied; thus, the trips referred to in the report are round-trips: trips to and from a destination.

Travel for Any Purpose on Interstate 25

Residents responding to the survey were asked to indicate how many times in the last year they had made trips for any purpose on Interstate 25. Virtually all respondents reported having used the Interstate at least once in the past year on a weekday (97%), and at least once on a weekend (94%). Among all respondents (including those making no trips), the average number of weekday trips made in the last year on I-25 was about 91 trips; it was slightly higher (97) among those living in the southern portion of the study area than among those living in the northern portion (80). The average number of trips reported on weekends was 19 in the last year, similar among both those in the north and the south.





Figure 2: Percent of Respondents Making Any Trips in Last Year on Interstate 25, by Area of Residence

Travel for Sporting Events

Residents participating in the survey were asked to indicate how many times they attended a sporting event on weekdays and on weekends. The following examples were provided to help spur respondents' memories:

Examples of sporting events:

Denver: the Broncos, the Rapids, the Rockies, the Avalanche, the Nuggets, the Mammoth, DU Hockey, etc.

Boulder: CU Buffaloes football, basketball, etc.

Ft. Collins: CSU Rams football, basketball, etc.

Greeley: UNC Bears football, basketball, etc.

Budweiser Center: Eagles hockey, etc.

Weekdays




Figure 4: Percent of Respondents Attending Any Sporting Events on Weekdays at Each Location, by Area of Residence




Figure 5: Average Number of Trips per Year to Attend Sporting Events on Weekdays at Each Location, by Area of Residence

Overall, 49% of respondents had made at least one trip in the last year into Denver on a weekday to attend some kind of sporting event (see Figure 4); there was little difference in this rate by whether or not respondents lived in the north or south portion of the study area. The average number of round trips per respondent (including those who made no trips) into Denver on a weekday for a sporting event was 2.4 per year (see Figure 5 on page 15). Overall, 17% of respondents had traveled to Boulder for at least one sporting event; with those from the south part of the study area somewhat more likely to have done so (20%) than those who live in the north (11%).

Report of Results

The Budweiser Center was a popular sporting destination; 19% of respondents had visited it at least once on a weekday within the past year; it was much more popular among those residing in the north part of the study area (42%) than those in the south part (8%). Sports events in Fort Collins and Greeley were more likely to be attended by those in the north part of the study area (37% and 17%, respectively) than those in the south part of the study area (10% and 6%).

Among all respondents, Denver was the biggest trip generator for sporting events (2.4 weekday round trips per year per respondent). Fort Collins generated 0.9 weekday trips per year per respondent and the Budweiser Center 0.7 weekday trips per year per respondent. However, for those in the north, Fort Collins and the Budweiser Center attracted more weekday trips in the last year (2.1 and 1.9, respectively) than did Denver (1.7).



Weekends

Similar patterns were observed for weekend sporting events trips as for weekday trips. About half of respondents had made at least once trip to Denver for a sporting event, with Boulder, Fort Collins and the Budweiser Center being the next most popular destinations (18% to 19% of respondents had visited each at least once in the past year).

Again, it appeared that those who lived in the northern portion of the study area were more likely to make trips south to Denver for sporting events than were those who lived in the southern portion of the study area to travel to destinations in the northern portion.








Figure 7: Average Number of Trips per Year to Attend Sporting Events on Weekends at Each Location, by Area of Residence



Travel for Cultural and Special Events or Attractions

Those completing the survey were also asked to indicate how many times they attended a cultural event or a special event or visited other attractions on weekdays and weekends. Several descriptions were provided of the types of events respondents were meant to consider.


<u>Cultural events</u>: Attend a concert, watch a play, see a ballet, etc. <u>Special events</u>: Special events or festivals such as Taste of Colorado, Parade of Lights, Boulder Creek Festival, Loveland-Fort Collins Balloon Festival, etc. <u>Museum/zoo</u>: Museums, an amusement park, the zoo, or some other type of attraction.

Sixty-one percent of respondents reported attending a cultural event, special event or visiting another attraction on a weekday in downtown Denver at least once in the last year. About half said that they had attended one of these events elsewhere in Denver. Just over one-third of respondents reported attending a cultural event, special event or visiting other attractions in Boulder or Longmont in the last 12 months, while about a third had gone to or in Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley at least once on a weekday in the past year.





An even greater proportion had made trips for cultural events, special events or other attractions on the weekends. About three-quarters had made at least one trip to Boulder or Longmont on a weekend in the past year (see Figure 9 below). Downtown Denver had been visited at least once on a weekend by 64% of respondents within the last year, and 51% of respondents also had visited other areas of Denver. Just over a third of respondents had visited Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley on a weekend for a cultural event or attraction, with those who lived in the north part of the study area being much more likely to have done so (68%) than those who lived in the south part of the study area (21%).





Figure 10: Average Number of Trips per Year to Attend Cultural Events on Weekdays at Each Location, by Area of Residence

On average, respondents made 2.7 weekday trips and 2.8 weekend trips to downtown Denver in the past 12 months for cultural or special events or attractions (see Figure 10 and Figure 11 on the next page). The average number of round trips per respondent to locations elsewhere in Denver was 1.9 on weekdays and 2.0 on weekends. The Boulder/Longmont area was visited 1.7 times on average by respondents on weekdays, and 2.3 times on weekends in the past year. Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley were visited 1.7 times on average on weekdays, and 1.6 times on weekends by respondents in the past year. Those who lived in zip codes north of Highway 66 made more trips on average to these destinations (3.8 trips on weekdays and 3.8 trips on weekends) compared to those who lived in zip codes south of Highway 66 (0.7 trips on weekdays and 0.6 trips on weekends).

Travel for Social or Recreation Trips

Residents completing the survey were asked to indicate how many times they made trips for social or recreation reasons. The definition of these types of trips given to respondents was as below:

<u>Social/recreation</u>: Entertainment or recreation; for example, to visit friends or family, to dine at a restaurant, see a movie, participate in a sports activity (or take children to a sports activity), etc. This category also includes trips to attend a religious service or do a volunteer activity

Over two-thirds of respondents (69%) said that they had traveled to downtown Denver at least once on a weekday in the last year for a social or recreational purpose, or elsewhere in Denver. Over half of respondents reported traveling to Boulder or Longmont (59%) or to destinations in the north (55%) at least once on a weekday in the last year for social or recreational reasons and about 36% reported traveling for these reasons to another location at least once in the last year. Similar proportions reported traveling for social or recreational purposes on the weekends at least once in the past year (see Figure 13 on the next page).




Figure 12: Percent of Respondents Making Any Social Recreation Trips on Weekdays at Each Location, by Area of Residence




Figure 13: Percent of Respondents Making Any Social Recreation Trips on Weekends at Each Location, by Area of Residence







Figure 15: Average Number of Social/Recreation Trips per Year on Weekends at Each Location, by Area of Residence

On average, the number of round trips per respondent who lived in the north part of the study area to destinations to the south was 6 weekday trips and 4 weekend trips to downtown Denver per year, 8 weekday trips and 5 weekend trips to places elsewhere in Denver, and 8 weekday and 4 weekend trips to Boulder or Longmont (see Figure 14 and Figure 15 on the next page). Those in the south part of the study area made, on average, 8 weekday and 3 weekend social or recreation trips to Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley in the last year.

Travel for Shopping or Personal Business





Figure 16: Percent of Respondents Making Any Shopping Trips on Weekdays at Each Location, by Area of Residence

When asked how many times in the last 12 months they had made trips to shop or conduct personal business, about half of all respondents (53%) said that they traveled to downtown Denver at least once on a weekday (see Figure 16) and about the same proportion (52%) had made at least one weekend trip (see Figure 17). Nearly two-thirds of all survey participants reported making shopping trips to other places within Denver on a weekday and on a weekend. About 45 percent of those living in the northern portion of the study area had made weekday or weekend trips to Boulder or Longmont in the past year, while about a third of those living in the southern portion of the study area had traveled to Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley for a shopping trip.

The average number of round trips per respondent who lived in the north part of the study area to shopping or personal business destinations to the south was 3 weekday trips and 2 weekend trips to downtown Denver per year, 5 weekday trips and 3 weekend trips to places elsewhere in Denver, and 8 weekday and 3 weekend trips to Boulder or Longmont Those in the south part of the study area had made, on average, 10 weekday and 3 weekend shopping or personal business trips to Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley in the last year.





Figure 18: Average Number of Shopping Trips per Year on Weekdays at Each Location, by Area of Residence

Travel to Denver International Airport

Residents responding to the survey were asked to indicate how many times they traveled to Denver International Airport (DIA) on weekdays and on weekends. Most respondents had made at least one round trip in the last year, 85% had made at least one weekday trip and 75% had made at least one weekend trip. The average number of round trips to the airport by people who lived in the northern portion of the study area to DIA was 5.9 weekday trips in the last year, and 2.7 weekend trips.







Figure 21: Average Number of Trips per Year to Denver International Airport, by Area of Residence

Work or School Related Travel





Figure 23: Proportion of Employed or Student Respondents Who Used I-25 for Their Commute

About 8 in 10 survey participants reported being employed or a student. Of those who lived in the northern part of the study area, 27% said they commuted to an area in the southern part of the study area, or even further south (see Table 13 on the next page). Of those who lived in the southern part of the study area, 16% indicated they commuted to an area in the northern part of the study area. About a third of the employed or student respondents typically use I-25 for a "significant" portion (5 or more miles) of their commute (see Figure 23 below).



A single-occupancy vehicle was by far the most common form of commute transportation, used on average 4.14 days per week, The next most common mode was multipleoccupancy vehicles (0.60 days per week, on average), followed by walking (0.25 days per week), bikes (0.16 days per week) and mass transit (0.29 days per week). Transit was an option used much more by those who lived in the southern portion of the study area (0.40 days per week) than those who lived in the northern portion of the study area (0.04 days per week), which is not surprising, given the much higher availability of transit options in the metro-Denver area.

Travel for the Work and School Commute

Employed or student respondents were asked to indicate how many times they traveled for work or school commute trips to specific locations in the last year. A third of respondents (33%) reported traveling to downtown Denver for a work or school commute at least once on a weekday in the last year. About one in four (39%) traveled elsewhere in Denver for these reasons. Thirty-six percent reported traveling to Boulder or Longmont for a work or school commute, while another 36% said that they traveled to Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley at least once during the week for a work or school commute. Many respondents also made at least one commute trip on a weekend (see Figure 26 on the next page), but overall, these types of trips were made much less frequently (as can be seen in Figure 27 and Figure 28).

Of those who lived in the northern portion of the study area, 21% made at least one commute trip on a weekday in the past year to downtown Denver, 30% made at least one weekday commute trip to places elsewhere in Denver, and 23% made at least one weekday commute trip to Boulder or Longmont. Of those living in the southern portion of the study area, 19% made at least one weekday commute trip to Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley in the past year.




Figure 25: Percent of Employed or Student Respondents Making Work or School Commute Trips on Weekdays at Each Location, by Area of Residence




Figure 26: Percent of Employed or Student Respondents Making Work or School Commute Trips on Weekends at Each Location, by Area of Residence

The average number of commute round trips per respondent who lived in the north part of the study area to downtown Denver was 10 weekday trips and 1 weekend trip per year; to places elsewhere in Denver it was 18 weekday trips per year and 1 weekend trip per year, and 22 weekday and 2 weekend commute trips to Boulder or Longmont Those in the south part of the study area had made, on average, 18 weekday commute trips and 1 weekend commute trips to Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley in the last year.







Figure 28: Average Number of Work or School Commute Trips per Year on Weekends at Each Location, by Area of Residence



Travel for Work-related Trips

Employed or student survey participants were also asked to indicate how many times in the past year they traveled to each location for work-related trip (trips made for work purposes such as attending meetings, making deliveries, etc., but NOT the work commute).

While only 33% of respondents had made at least one weekday commute trip to downtown Denver in the past year, 41% made at least one work-related weekday trip to downtown Denver. Nearly half of employed or student respondents reported traveling elsewhere in Denver for work purposes at least once in the past year. About a third of employed or student respondents said that they traveled to Boulder or Longmont at least once on a weekday (33%) and nearly a third (31%) said that they traveled to Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley at least once in the last year for work.





When asked how many times in the past year they traveled for work-related trips on weekends, fewer respondents said that they traveled to each location for these reasons. About one in five employed or student respondents (19%) reported traveling to downtown Denver at least once on a weekend for work-related reasons and a similar proportion (21%) said that they traveled elsewhere in Denver for work purposes. Sixteen percent of respondents said that they had traveled at least once on a weekend in the past year to Boulder or Longmont for a work-related trip, while a similar proportion reported making at least one trip to Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley for this reason. Very few weekend work-related trips were generated by respondents (see Figure 32 on the next page).

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On average, about 6 weekday work-related trips to downtown Denver were made per employed respondent who lived in the northern portion of the study area in the last year. They made, on average, 7 weekday work-related trips per employed person to places elsewhere in Denver, and about 9 weekday work-related trips per employed person to Boulder or Longmont. Those who lived in the southern portion of the study area made about 6 weekday work-related trips on average in the last year to Fort Collins, Loveland or Greeley.





Figure 31: Average Number of Work-Related Trips per Year on Weekdays at Each Location, by Area of Residence

Opinions about Traveling North I-25 and Awareness of the North I-25 EIS Study

A few questions on the survey were devoted to asking respondents their opinions about travel on the North I-25 corridor and their awareness of the North I-25 EIS project. When asked if they regularly avoid traveling on I-25, just under half of respondents (46%) reported doing so. Of those who reported avoiding I-25, a majority (82%) said that they did so because there is "too much congestion." About half (52%) said that they "don't feel safe" when traveling on I-25 and about 3 in 10 (27%) reported that they avoid traveling on I-25 because it takes longer.





Figure 34: Reasons for Avoiding I-25

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Residents responding to the survey were asked if they had heard of the North I-25 EIS Study before taking the survey. Approximately three-quarters of respondents (76%) said they had not heard of it. Of the 24% who had heard of the study, half stated they had read about it in the newspaper and 29% reported seeing it on the television. Sixteen percent of respondents said they had heard about the study by "word of mouth" from family and friends and 11% reported hearing about it on the radio. Fewer than 10% of respondents reported gaining knowledge about the North I-35 Study at public community meetings, Council meetings or committee meetings and 6% said they could not remember where they heard about the study. More than one in five of respondents (22%) said they heard about it from an "other" source.





Figure 36: Information Sources

When asked how they would like to be informed about matters related to the study of North I-25, about half of respondents said that newspaper articles were their preferred information source about the study (49%), followed closely by public service announcements (46%). About one-third (32%) reported that they would like to receive information through a newsletter and one-quarter (24%) said that they would like to obtain information from the project website. Sixteen percent of respondents said that they mould prefer ads in the newspaper and fewer than 10% of respondents said that they preferred receiving information about the study via e-mail (9%), at public community meetings (7%) or via another source of information (4%).




Figure 37: Preferred Information Sources

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Appendix III: Estimated Total Trips by Area of Residence and Type of Trip

The tables in this section display the estimated total number of trips made by residents in the study area. Ninety-five percent confidence intervals were constructed around these estimates. Estimates were made assuming the number of trips should be applied to all adults in the study area, and also were made assuming the number of trips should be applied to all households. For many types of trips, the household estimate is likely more accurate, as more than one household member would make the type of trip being asked about. For example, all or at least more than one household member may travel together to a sporting event.

Appendix V: Survey Methodology

Sample Selection

The study area includes I-25 corridor between the Fort Collins-Wellington area and Denver. (Figure 1 on page 10 shows a map of the study area.) A random sample of 10,000 residential mailing addresses from zip codes in the study area was selected for the North I-25 EIS Household Travel Study. The households were chosen such that 5,000 came from the northern portion of the study area (roughly north of Highway 66), and 5,000 came from the southern portion of the study area.

These households were selected using a stratified, systematic sampling method within the zip codes.¹ Attached housing units were over-sampled to compensate for detached housing unit residents' tendency to return surveys at a higher rate. An individual within each household was selected using the birthday method.²

Survey Administration and Response Rate

Households received three mailings each beginning in March, 2005. The first contact was a prenotification postcard, followed a week later by a survey accompanied by a cover letter signed by the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) project manager. A second wave of the survey was sent another week later, with a reminder cover letter. Completed surveys were collected over the following four weeks. Approximately two weeks after the second wave of the survey, reminder calls were placed to just over 3,000 residents who had not yet responded (and for whom a phone number could be looked up).

About 5% of the surveys were returned because they either had incorrect addresses or were vacant. Of the 9,536 eligible households, 3,152 completed the survey, providing a response rate of 33%.

Confidence Intervals

It is customary to describe the precision of estimates made from surveys by a "level of confidence" (or margin of error). The 95 percent confidence level for the survey is generally no greater than plus or minus 1.7 percentage points around any given percent reported for the entire sample (3,152 completed interviews).

Weighting the Data

The demographic characteristics of the survey sample were compared to those found in the 2000 Census estimates and other population norms for the study area and were statistically adjusted to reflect the larger population when necessary. The results of the weighting scheme are presented in the following table. The shaded variables were the ones by which survey results were weighted.

¹ Systematic sampling is a method that closely approximates random sampling by selecting every Nth address until the desired number of households are chosen. Carrier routes are mail carrier delivery zones defined by the USPS.

² The birthday method selects a person within the household by asking the "person whose birthday has most recently passed" to complete the questionnaire. The underlying assumption in this method is that day of birth has no relationship to the way people respond to surveys.

Data Analysis

Completed questionnaires were checked for accuracy by National Research Center, Inc. staff. The data were then entered, and the results analyzed by National Research Center, Inc. staff using the Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS). For the most part, frequency distributions and averages (means) are presented in the body of the report.

Calculating the Average Number of Trips per Respondent

Survey participants were asked about how often in the past year they made different types of trips in or through the study area. Broad categories of frequency rates were used. In order to make point estimates of the number of trips made per respondent per year, the following numbers of trips were assigned to each category:
