#### SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION:

[Note: Action items are in **bold**.]

- 1. Jennifer Gorek welcomed everyone (21 people were in attendance). Self introductions were made. An agenda and handouts are attached.
- 2. Jennifer described the agenda overall, beginning with a description of the North I-25 EIS process. She described the major elements of the Preferred Alternative and described what will be in ROD 2.
- 3. Johnny Olson clarified that the RAMP funding (\$55M) is public-private partnership (PPP) money. The DRCOG RTP application was written for \$110M, which includes assumptions for PPP money.
- 4. Jennifer described the primary tasks being conducted as part of the ROD 2 and the Preferred Alternative cross section.
- 5. Myron Hora said that because CDOT does not have the full funding, an interim improvement is being planned. This will have narrower inside and outside shoulders than the ones in the EIS. FHWA has not approved this cross section yet. Construction is planned to begin in 2015 with opening planned in 2016.
- 6. Myron added that the ROD 2 will be written to the Preferred Alternative, then a NEPA reevaluation will be done for what is planned to be built.
- 7. Myron then described the three possible interim improvements between E-470 and SH 7.
- 8. Commissioner Conway asked how long the distance is between E-470 and SH 7. It is a little over a mile. Why does it cost so much (\$1M to \$1.5M)? Bob Marusin responded that this includes signage and striping. It does not include any improvements in the SB direction.
- 9. Will this tie into the work that is under construction? That work is planned to be finished in December 2015, so we will be starting while they are finishing.
- 10. The second interim concept starts to run into constraints, which is why it costs more (\$7M to \$9M)
- 11. If we were to improve this the way we should, so it was done right, it would be the \$23M concept. Why would this be an interim improvement? Because of the narrow shoulders.

- 12. Myron also described the improvements being designed under the Phase 1 ROD (SH 66 to SH 56, US 34/I-25 interchange, and Crossroads Boulevard to SH 14), as well as the current construction project south of 120th Avenue.
- 13. Carol Parr described the express bus improvements. We will be getting 13 buses. When do improvements at Harmony Road begin? CDOT is working on a plan to manage the parking. An access agreement is being drafted to charge parking being used by Common Carriers. Van Go will be kept free of charge. The park-in-ride will be expanded.
- 14. CDOT Division of Transit and Rail is re-looking at the commuter rail study to update the costs, look at other viable options, synthesize recommendations from other studies. They will be meeting with other agencies to get their input.
- 15. The public open house will be October 8, 2014. We will have information at the open house about the ROD 2, and updates about express bus and commuter rail.
- 16. Will we be looking at future TIGER applications? How can we make this a priority? The local agencies need to be more vocal and supportive—in a collaborative manner.
- 17. With the bus services—are there improvements planned to I-25/US 34? The only improvements planned are a shelter.
  - There will be mid-day trips that will operate out of downtown Ft. Collins.
  - A third ROD can be considered to run buses on the shoulder.
- 18. Capacity at the Harmony Road park-n-ride will be an issue. There is not enough space. US 34 will also be a capacity issue. As these interchanges get expanded, we can look at adding more capacity.
- 19. Mayor Atchison asked if there have been any contact with Urban Drainage to ask them to contribute funds. He suggested we should contact him before going to Urban Drainage since he is on the Board. Herb offered his assistance. A white paper might be useful to provide to Herb. There are reserved funds at Urban Drainage that have not been committed. Herb emphasized that going to the Congressional leaders as a group makes a big impression in Washington, DC. Everyone needs to carry the same message.
- 20. On the \$55M, what will be recommended? That is the design and construction from 4,000 feet south of 120th Avenue to just shy of E-470. If bids come in low, we may have enough funding to go farther north.

The North I-25 ROD 2 public open house was attended by 40 members of the general public. The purpose of the meeting was to provide background on the North I-25 Final EIS, provide an update on design and construction activities along the North I-25 corridor covered under the 2011 Record of Decision, and describe the activities covered by the ROD 2. - Progress on corridor since 2011

An agenda and handout provided at the meting are attached. The PowerPoint presentation given at the meeting is also attached.

#### SUMMARY OF PRESENTATION:

- Jennifer Gorek described the purpose of the meeting, gave a history of the EIS, described what was in the first ROD, activities occurring since the ROD was signed, express bus improvements, and the Preferred Alternative in the ROD 2.
- 2. Myron Hora described the interim improvements. The interim improvements will likely not go to E-470. Shoulders will be narrower. The elevation of I-25 will not be changed so some floodplain issues may not be addressed.
- 3. Karen Stuart asked about schedule. We are planning to start in summer/fall 2015 and be complete at the end of 2016.
- 4. What about 228 funding? Myron said we might not have that in hand—some funding might need to go farther north.

#### COMMENTS FROM ONE-ON-ONE DISCUSSIONS:

- 1. Will this be a P3?
- 2. What funding are we assuming from DRCOG?
- Wanted to know the timing of service launch and the stop in Loveland. Interested in using the bus to commute between Loveland and the McWhinney office near DUS. (Jay Hardy, McWhinney VP and General Manager of Centerra)
- 4. Glad the express bus service is happening; we can't continue to pour more concrete on the traffic problem.
- 5. You should seriously consider alternative-fueled buses.
- 6. What advantage is there when you are sitting in the same traffic? Response: The express bus will use the managed lanes so they will not be sitting in traffic except north of SH 7.
- 7. Are there plans to offer bus service to the other communities along I-25?
- 8. I live in Greeley and plan to use this bus to Denver.
- 9. When will the commuter rail be implemented, what's the timing? Response: There is not identified funding at this time. When the funding is identified, then a schedule can be created for implementation.
- 10. For the commuter rail alignment, as it exits Longmont to the east, consider using Great Western track rather than SH 119.
- 11. Please post the commuter rail boards with all the other open house materials.
- 12. If BNSF is unwilling to sell the land to Colorado and NFR communities for commuter rail, then make sure there is a right of ownership. This will protect public dollars [which might be] invested in commuter rail, so that passenger rail is not kicked off the rails at a later date.
- 13. Nate VanderBroek has moved on from the NFRMPO, so Becky Karasko will be the representative on the North I-25 Commuter Rail Update.
- 14. When will property owners along I-25 be contacted about Commuter Rail, only when it's too late? Response: A reasonable expectation of funding and implementation is the point at which property owners could expect to be involved/contacted.
- 15. For the North I-25 Commuter Rail Update TAC #2 meeting, please bring maps of the right-ofway, more specific than those shown in the open house maps. We need to begin the discussion and identify more specific right-of-way actions.
- 16. Between SH 119 and RTD's right-of-way [near east-west Weld CR 8], the better alignment is along I-25, not WCR 7. WCR 7 has become too built up.
- 17. What? You're doing a study of right-of-way now, to prepare to do another study, before it can be implemented? Response: Yes, CDOT is continuing to move the examination of this part of the 2011 EIS forward with the rest of the recommendations.
- 18. I-25 may be the better long-term location for Commuter Rail all the way to Fort Collins. The nature and growth of the communities is changing and spreading out to I-25.

- 19. Frederick, Firestone, & Dacono discussed an extension of RTD's North Metro alignment along Colorado Boulevard. When the station was proposed to be in Firestone, Dacono was less supportive because they would have the impact (rails), without the benefit (station).
- 20. Commuter rail on US 287 and express bus on I-25 could work well together to give people lots of travel options.
- 21. The NFRMPO is proposing in the 2040 plan update to show transit corridors connecting to the IX Bus service on I-25: SH 14 from Fort Collins to I-25, SH 34 from Loveland to I-25, and Greeley to I-25. That will go to the NFRMPO TAC next week.
- 22. How much would the three different interim options cost to take the tolled express lane all the way to SH 7?
- 23. Would it make sense to just build the tolled express lane in the southbound direction since the majority of the congestion is southbound?



## Why Are We Meeting Tonight?

The first Record of Decision (ROD), signed in 2011, did not include the segment of I-25 between 120<sup>th</sup> Avenue and SH 7 because no funds had been identified for construction. Now that these funds have been identified, CDOT and FHWA will be putting the Proposed Action into a second Record of Decision (ROD 2). The Proposed Action includes adding one tolled express (managed) lane in each direction from 120<sup>th</sup> Avenue to SH 7.



### WHAT WILL THE TRAVEL BENEFITS BE?

- The tolled express lane from 120<sup>th</sup> to SH 7 will provide a faster travel time for carpools, buses and double or single occupant vehicles if they pay a toll. This lane will connect to the tolled express lanes currently being built south of 120<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
- Motorists have the option to choose a reliable trip. The express lanes provide an opportunity to maintain reliable travel time for buses, high occupancy vehicles (HOVs) and toll payer users in perpetuity.
- The faster travel time option for bus riders (including ones using the new CDOT bus service) will be a clear incentive to encourage regular users of the corridor to switch to transit.
- The anticipated traffic volumes on the express lanes will reduce volumes on the general purpose lanes.

### WHAT ABOUT BUS AND RAIL IMPROVEMENTS?

CDOT in 2015 will be implementing express bus service from Fort Collins to Denver Union Station. This service includes:

- Stops at Harmony Road/I-25, US 34/I-25, and Denver Union Station
- Five round trips per weekday

CDOT is also doing a Commuter Rail Study to update costs and synthesize recommendations from other studies conducted recently such as the Northwest Area Mobility Study, North Metro EIS, Interregional Connectivity Study and others.







# ROD 2: 120th Avenue to SH 7 Preferred Alternative Cross Section




