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

Region 1 Bridge and Expansion Joint Rehab

JEFFERSON COUNTY — On MAY 3, the Colorado Department of Transportation and Lobato Construction LLC., will begin work on the Region 1 Bridge and Expansion Joint Rehab Project throughout the Denver Metro Area, the mountain corridor, and on the Eastern Plains. This work will consist of bridge preventative maintenance that includes; bridge bearing replacement, expansion device replacements, bridge deck rehabilitation and asphalt paving. This work will increase the lifespan of each structure.

TRAVEL IMPACTS

- Motorists should expect single lane closures and slight delays.
- Work will take place 5 days a week.
- There will be lane width restrictions of 11 feet.
- Work will take place Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Night work will take place Sunday through Thursday 8 p.m. to 5 a.m.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

Lobato Construction LLC. of Westminster, CO, is the prime contractor on this \$1.232 million project.

Work is expected to be completed by September 2021. Work is weather dependent and subject to change.

REMEMBER: SLOW FOR THE CONE ZONE

- The following tips are to help you stay safe while traveling through maintenance and construction work zones.
- Do not speed in work zones. Obey the posted speed limits.
- Stay Alert! Expect the unexpected.
- Watch for workers. Drive with caution.
- Expect delays, especially during peak travel times.
- Allow ample space between you and the car in front of you.
- Anticipate lane shifts and merge when directed to do so.
- Avoid using mobile devices such as phones while driving in work zones.
- Turn on headlights so that workers and other drivers can see you.
- Be especially alert at night while driving in work zones.
- Be patient!

COVID-19

Safe transportation infrastructure is essential for emergency first responders and freight drivers as Colorado navigates the COVID-19 pandemic. With that in mind, road maintenance and construction continues on CDOT projects with social distancing and other health safety measures to reduce COVID-19 exposure on the worksite.
